



Just bought a new Corvette? Or just love them? Welcome, you've come to the right place!

The Lone Star Corvette Club is dedicated to the Corvette lifestyle and the people that own them.

Our Club slogan says it all:

Good Friends... Great Cars!

Founded in 1982, the Club now has over 1,000 members – each with his/her own story to tell of how they found that perfect "Vette." Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, it offers just about any activity an owner of "America's Sports Car" could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, DragRacing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

Road Trips – The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. A large group recently returned from a nine-day caravan to Vettes on the Rockies held in Winter Park, Colorado. Past trips have taken us to the Black Hills of South Dakota, the Barrett Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the National Corvette Museum's 15th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

Day Trips – Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members' garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other's company.

Open Road Racing – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just "click" on "Open Road Racing".

Drag Racing – Another "go fast" group within the Club are the Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplexfor trophies and bragging rights. Many members –both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Drag Racing</u>".

Autocross – Others in the Club prefer to sharpen their driving skills by competing in Autocross. An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just "click" on "Autocross".

NCRS – Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just "click" on "NCRS".

Car Shows – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or an out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in the Dallas Autorama. On the first Saturday of each month, you'll find a bunch of us at Cars & Coffee in Plano, "kicking tires" and telling tall tales about our cars.

Displays and Parades – The public loves to look at our Corvettes. Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a large contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We've been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway's oval before races. Christmas finds us backing up the bikers in the Great Texas Toy Run that benefits thousands of needy children in the area. The Dallas Veterans' Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

Lone Star Corvette Classic – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the "Classic" attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US and Canada. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including judged and Show N Shine indoor car shows, a variety of automotive vendors, good food, and exciting track events held on the Texas Motor Speedway's oval and road course. 100% of the net proceeds from the Classic go to support the Club's two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children's Charities, and a third charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members.

Club Meetings – The Club meets on the second Saturday of each month at various locations around the Metroplex. We would love to have you come to a meeting and "check us out."

I'd like to encourage you to further explore our website. A glimpse at the Club's Event Calendar will give you a good overview of just how active and diverse our Club is. Just "click" on "Event Calendar".

2018 and 2019 Corvettes

As you may have read the production of the 2018 Corvette will end very early, the week of January 22. The 2019 will begin production the following week.

You can order a 2019 in a few weeks, specifically November 30. If you are thinking about this, let me remind you that as a member of the NCM you are eligible for the GM Supplier Discount. You can save hundreds, even thousands on not only new Corvettes, but also on eligible new Chevrolet, Buick, GMC and Cadillac vehicles.

A Museum member in Illinois reported to me that on a 2017 Suburban he was quoted \$8,700 off a \$75,000 sticker price as his GM Supplier Discount. These discounts are not available with some other offers. Be sure to check with your sales consultant at Classic/Thompson. They may have other GM discounts periodically available that are greater than the GM Supplier Discount.

Collectible Corvettes

Your new or newer Corvette is considered a "collectible" car. As such you are eligible for collector car insurance rates in most cases. If your Corvette is on a regular policy with your daily driver, you will save many hundreds by moving to a collector policy. In addition the policy is agreed value, so you can initially establish the value you will be paid for a total loss.



The organizations considered would meet these criteria:

Operate as a 501C(3) entity.

Serve their local community.

Welcome assistance from Lone Star Corvette Club.

The Club Member submitting the organization for consideration would do the following:

Sponsor the organization and act as liaison between the organization and LSCC.

Conduct due diligence on the organizations mission and service to the community.

Serve as coordinator or assistant coordinator for the LSCC volunteers, or coordinate delivery of items donated to the organization.

Submit a request in writing, including full information about the organization and a specific request for assistance, to the Club President.

Requests for assistance will be reviewed prior to the 1st month of each calendar quarter, and the approved requests will be announced at the 1st Club Meeting of each quarter. At that meeting, plans for providing assistance

to the approved organization will be presented to the Membership.

One of the core values of Lone Star Corvette Club (LSCC) is giving back to our community. Each year, LSCC members select a Rotating Charity, which will receive a portion of the funds raised in the Auctions at our annual event, the Lone Star Corvette Classic. The Classic takes place in May of each year, and proceeds from the Auction are distributed to the Club's beneficiaries in the Fall.

LSCC hosts presentations from Rotating Charity candidates at a Club Meeting in the 1st quarter of the year. Following the presentations, members vote, and the organization receiving the most votes is named the Rotating Charity for that year.

These	are the requirements for an organization to be considered by the membership:
	Each organization must be sponsored by an LSCC Member
	Each organization must submit proof that it has a 501C(3) designation from the IRS
	Each organization must make a presentation at the designated Club meeting
	Each organization must submit a short article for the Club newsletter describing their mission, goals, activities and beneficiaries
Here's	a few tips to make your organization stand out:
	Put your best foot forward at the presentation: videos, slideshows ,demonstrations, testimonials, and brochures featuring your organization are all encouraged
	Make sure your presentation clearly answers these questions:
	o What is your mission?
	What percentage of your organization's revenue goes toward your mission?
	O Who receives assistance from your group? How do you select your recipients?
	o How are you funded? Do you receive funds from national organizations?
	o Do you use volunteers? Where and how do you get volunteers?
Histori	cally, Rotating Charities that do these things are the most successful:
	Make your appeal personal – our members want to know who you are helping. If you can introduce us to a recipient, or can relate a personal story, it helps us understand what you do and who benefits from your work
0	Tell us why you need our help specifically – are you a local group, a group that does not have access to national funding, a group that assists a small segment of society?
	Talk to the member sponsoring your organization, or contact an LSCC Officer, and get to know our Club; tailor your presentation to the LSCC membership.







2019 Corvette Early Production Announced

October 12, 2017



Well, that was quick! Rumors have been confirmed that production of the 2018 Corvette will cease early for the model year. The last date to order a 2018 Corvette is November 16, and the last week of production for the 2018 model year is the week of January 22. The 2019 model year will begin rolling off the line the week of January 29, 2018. Orders for the model start November 30. (whew we need a calendar for all those dates!) Right now, planned volume for the 2018 Corvette is just shy of 9,700 units, making it one of the shortest model years.

No major changes are coming for 2019 as models, colors and options from 2018 will carry over (sans the Carbon 65 Edition). Less than 100 65th Anniversary Carbon Editions are remaining of the 650 cap for 2018. A new order guide for 2019 will be released on November 20.

Sebring Orange (G26) can now be ordered, and a small ramp up of the new hue begins the week of December 11 (in the new paint shop, we might add).

But what about the new paint shop? Production at Bowling Green Assembly starts back up November 6, and at that time the 'basics' (Black, Arctic White, Torch Red, Corvette Racing Yellow) will begin rolling through the state-of-the-art paint shop. Tintcoats will follow the basics at a later date (Admiral Blue, Blade Silver, Cyber Matrix Gray, Long Beach Red, Sebring Orange and Watkins Glen Gray.

As for the quality of the new paint – we're told customers will not be disappointed. Some even tout the quality to be better than the crème de la crème Cadillac paint.

And as for a "C8" mid-engine Corvette, no official word has been received announcing the highly anticipated model. But it has been photographed quite a bit lately. Perhaps it's GM's way of teasing us just a little bit! Next year's Michelin NCM Bash will certain be colorful when GM takes the stage to present on 2018 and 2019... and we know you'll want to be there to ask questions and be in the know.
