#### Just bought a new Corvette? Or just love them? Welcome, you've come to the right place! The Lone Star Corvette Club is dedicated to the Corvette lifestyle and the people that own them. Our Club slogan says it all:

#### Good Friends... Great Cars!

Founded in 1982, the Club now has over 1,000 members – each with his/her own story to tell of how they found that perfect "Vette." Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, it offers just about any activity an owner of "America's Sports Car" could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, DragRacing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

**Road Trips** – Want to explore the wide open road? The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. A large group recently returned from a caravan to Eureka Springs, Arkansas, winning the club participation event at the show. Past trips have taken us to the Upper Pennisula of Michigan, the Barrett Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the National Corvette Museum's 15th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

**Day Trips** – Want to enjoy North Texas? Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members' garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other's company.

**Open Road Racing** – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just"click" on "<u>Open Road Racing</u>".

**Drag Racing** – Want to "go fast"? Join the club Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplexfor trophies and bragging rights. Many members –both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Drag Racing</u>".

**Autocross** – Want to sharpen your driving skills? Try autocross! An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Autocross</u>".

**NCRS** – Want your older model corvette to be an accurate icon? Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just "click" on "<u>NCRS</u>".

**Car Shows** – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or an out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in Dallas Autorama.

**Displays and Parades** – Looking to share the Corvetter spirit? Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a large contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We've been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway's oval before races. Christmas finds us backing up the bikers in the Great Texas Toy Run that benefits thousands of needy children in the area. The Dallas Veterans' Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

**Lone Star Corvette Classic** – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the "Classic" attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US and Canada. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including judged and Show N Shine indoor car shows, a variety of automotive vendors, good food, and exciting track events held on the Texas Motor Speedway's oval and road course. 100% of the net proceeds from the Classic go to support the Club's two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children's Charities, and a third charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members.

**Club Meetings** – We want you! The Club meets on the second Saturday of each month at various locations around the Metroplex. We would love to have you come to a meeting and "check us out." I'd like to encourage you to further explore our website. A glimpse at the Club's Event Calendar will give you a good overview of just how active and diverse our Club is. 

NCM News

The National Corvette Museum finally was able to hold its first event of 2020, the 26<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration, September 2-5. Please see the article in this newsletter about our club's trip there. Following are details about the event itself.

#### Winner's Circle

On Wednesday night, September 2<sup>nd</sup>, the Anniversary kicked off with the Winner's Circle dinner, honoring donors to the Museum. LSCC members made up almost 20% of the total attendees. Lone Star members recognized for their generosity included-

The Lone Star Corvette Club was also recognized for their donations to the NCM in 2019. John Raiden, Club President and all the LSCC members on hand took this time to present a check for \$10,000 to the Museum, guaranteeing the Club's membership in the Winner's Circle for 2020.

#### 2021 Corvette News

Seminars held during the Anniversary event revealed news concerning the 2021 Corvette.

For those with a C8 on order or hoping to snag a new Corvette, the best news was announced by Plant Manager Kai Spande. Bowling Green assembly has started a second shift. This will substantially increase production numbers on the C8.

As part of the National Corvette Museum's 26th Anniversary Celebration GM Bowling Green Assembly debuted for the first time actual painted panels of the two new colors for 2021 – Red Mist Metallic Tintcoat and Silver Flare Metallic. Below are photos comparing them to 2020 colors including Torch Red (which will continue for 2021), Long Beach Red and Blade Silver (which the colors replace).

During the Corvette presentation on Friday, Harlan Charles described the Silver Flare as having a 'lot of travel' and looking very different as you walk around the car. The Red Mist was described as a 'fiery red, brighter than some of the ones we've previously done.'

Harlan and Tadge Juechter indicated that the very first 2021 validation cars are in the process of being built with Silver Mist being the first, and Red Mist being the fourth – so the opportunity to 'see' a full car in the color is forthcoming. Those cars are pre-production and gives the team a few months to check them out before building customer cars.



Another welcome change is that Magnetic Selective Ride Control will be offered as a standalone option. Now you can get this amazing suspension system without having to opt for the Z-51 performance package.

Wireless CarPlay is also new for 2021 and it is standard equipment across the board.

#### Ambassador Meeting News

At the NCM Ambassador meeting on Saturday, more good news was revealed.

First, it was announced that in nationwide competition, LSCC was judged to have the second-best social media program. Congratulations are in order to Linda Shellberg for her outstanding work for the Club.

Later in the meeting, Glenn Johnson, NCM Board Chairman, revealed some major news to the Ambassadors. Plans are being finalized for a major addition to the Museum. It will accommodate the many Corvettes recently donated and more to be acquired. The new construction will attach to the existing building to the right of the original main entrance and extend into what is now large vehicle parking. Exact timing of project commencement is not yet determined. More information will come soon.

Finally Master Ambassador designations for 2019 were announced. For the 15<sup>th</sup> consecutive year, Johnny & Edie Downs, representing LSCC, received the award. Major support of the NCM by the Club and its members are required to obtain Master Ambassador status. So, thanks to LSCC and all its members for making this happen again.

The Concours Judging Program is a new venue that allows Corvettes with modifications to participate in the NCRS judging activities. Many of these modified Corvettes are well presented but would not fare well under the traditional Flight Judging system; thus, owners now have an avenue for display and judging. Modified Corvettes will be judged in two categories - Stock Division and Modified Division. The Stock Division offers two awards (Blue Ribbon and Red Ribbon) while the Modified Division also offers two awards (427 Award and 327 Award). Full details on the registration process are not yet available, and I should have them for the next newsletter. Probably both NCRS and LSCC registration will be required.



#### CORVETTE RACING AT MID-OHIO: Garcia, Taylor Pace 1-2 Finish for Corvette C8.R By Corvette Racing Fans



No. 3 Corvette C8.R takes fourth GTLM win of season

LEXINGTON, Ohio (Sept. 27, 2020) – Corvette Racing went wire-to-wire Sunday to claim a GT Le Mans (GTLM) victory at the Acura Sports Car Challenge at Mid-Ohio Sports Car Course. Antonio Garcia and Jordan Taylor won for the fourth time this year in the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship with the No. 3 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Chevrolet Corvette C8.R.

The result extended their lead in the GTLM Drivers Championship and Chevrolet's advantage in the class Manufacturers standings. Corvette Racing won at Mid-Ohio for the ninth time, and Sunday's victory was the fifth in the first year of the mid-engine C8.R.

Oliver Gavin and Tommy Milner placed second in the No. 4 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Chevrolet Corvette C8.R to remain second in GTLM points. It was the 63rd 1-2 finish for Corvette Racing and third of the year.

Corvette Racing led the entire two hours and 40 minutes – 110 laps in all. Taylor began from pole but Gavin got the jump early and led the first 17 laps before going slightly wide at the end of the backstraight. That allowed Taylor to move back in front, and the No. 3 Corvette led the rest of the way.






