NCM News

The holiday season is a really slow time for news, so I will jump ahead and tell you about two great trips to the National Corvette Museum for LSCC members coming up later in the year. Then I will pass on some news I learned at the NCM fourth quarter board meeting.

NCM Bash

The Bash, this year April 22nd-25th, is a great time to learn about Corvette's latest and greatest. The first public hands-on opportunity with the C7 came at this event in 2013. Last year the Z06 convertible was unveiled at the Bash. A bevy of Corvette engineers and marketing folks will be on hand to answer all questions.

In addition, there will be Museum tours, Corvette plant tours, and road tours. For the first time at the Bash, the Motorsports Park will be open beginning on Wednesday, the 22nd, for touring laps, hot laps and other activities.

Seven cars from LSCC are already committed to this trip. We will be travelling on Tuesday, April 21st, to be able to take part in track activities on Wednesday. We have rooms blocked in Bowling Green. If you would like to join us, contact me, and I will send you the hotel information.

LSCC Track Days

As explained elsewhere in this newsletter, members will decide the final destination of our "big trip" of 2015. Both choices, though, go through Bowling Green. We will use two of our track days we earned in support of the NCM Motorsports Park construction.

Plans at this time are for the first day at the track to consist of a variety of events, including touring laps, hot laps, autocross and more. The second day will be for the serious road course drivers, with a full one-day high performance driving experience. So, the really neat thing about these two days is that you have all sorts of options:

- If you want the total track experience, spend two days at the Motorsports Park.
- Not so much into road racing? Spend day one at the track, then do a Corvette Plant tour and behind the scenes Museum tour on day two.
- Do not want to spend much time at the track? In addition to the Museum and plant tours, we can schedule some great road tours.
- Have never done a Museum delivery? Register for the Museum Experience, <u>YOUR</u> Corvette will be detailed by the NCM staff and placed on display in the Museum. All this while a member of the Museum staff gives you a special plant tour, followed by a private tour of the Museum. This replicates the NCM Museum delivery, right down to the commemorative plaque. Others have yet to understand some of the unseen injuries they have been left with, but find it hard to hold onto jobs. DOF will help them with emergency financial assistance for their basic living needs, assistance with resume preparation, job search, and mentoring with other veterans. Additionally, DOF has

programs for them to connect with other veterans through fun outdoor activities. DOF's goal is to help them through this challenging period, and then have them give back to DOF by helping other veterans who are not as far along in the process. In 2010 the organization was awarded a grant from the City of Irving and the process began to acquire a 501.c.3 to make the program a tax exempt non-profit. The organization is comprised of police and fire personnel to form the Board of Directors. There are no paid employees and only minor office expenses. The majority of our donations come from the citizens and businesses of Irving. It is with their support that we are able to

help the children and their families.

School counselors at Early Development and Elementary schools in Irving nominate the children that they know really need the help. Then Blue Christmas delivers a meal for the whole family and new toys to each child in the household. The food and gifts are delivered in police cars, fire trucks, ambulances and private vehicles by off duty officers and firemen.

It has been a pleasure for us to be able to contribute in making this time of year special for the children. We hope to continue this tradition that was started in 1979 for many years to come.

A little background info for this year's trip:

- 1. National Corvette Museum Motorsports Park (NCMMP) (Part of both trips.) LSCC and its members contributed to the NCMMP for several years prior to its 2014 *Grand Opening*. In appreciation for LSCC's contributions, NCM has given LSCC four days to use Motorsports Park any way we like. Well, you can't waste such a generous offer so we decided to use it as the springboard for the 2015 Club trip. In addition, Lon Helton, an LSCC member living in Nashville, Tennessee, has volunteered to set up a *VIP tour* of the Country Music Hall of Fame for us. (This would be a part of either trip.) Indianapolis Motor Speedway/Bloomington Gold For 2015, Bloomington Gold is being held at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway. Bloomington Gold is one of the largest Corvette events in the country with daily car shows on the judging field, hundreds of vendors, Corvettes for sale, and road tours.
- 2. **Rick Hendrick Invitation** This trip includes tours of the <u>Hendrick Motorsports</u> NASCAR team race shops and Mr. Hendrick's amazing private collection of Corvettes and muscle cars. 




