

Caravans of Corvettes left Texas on Wednesday and Thursday. The Wednesday caravan drove scenic road, through Oklahoma and Arkansas for two days before reaching Eureka Springs. The first day began with the group driving through Southeastern Oklahoma to Beavers Bend State Park on the Mountain Fork River for lunch. The trip continued over the beautiful and curve filled drive in the Winding Stair Mountains into Arkansas and on to Hot Springs. The day was not without incident, as a bolt punctured Grady Cherry's tire just after lunch. He was forced to limp into Broken Bow, Oklahoma and spend the night as the local Chevy dealer shipped in a replacement tire. Back on the road Grady met us in Eureka Springs.

The Thursday caravan, led by Curt and Sharon Troster, drove straight through in one day. But it was not without incident. Ray and Denice Kaspers broke down and had to be towed to a dealer for repairs. This was not entirely unexpected as the Kaspers were in a BMW, trying to hang with Corvettes. They did get going and made it to Eureka Springs.

Partying around the pool at the Quality Inn kicked into high gear as the caravans arrived. The only break in the action was for the poker run organizational meeting held by new leaders Dick and Olivia Krull.

Friday morning most folks headed over to registration and picked up a few items at the NCM tent. Then, the ladies headed downtown for shopping. Most of the guys avoided downtown, several leaving town altogether on the fuel economy run. This year it was a beautiful 96 mile drive into southern Missouri around Table Rock Lake. We learned on Saturday that three LSCC cars won awards in the competition.

Friday afternoon was car washing time as many prepared for the Saturday car show. As the day wore on washing waned and partying took over. For the first time since 2012, we did not have a wedding of LSCC members on Friday. So, we celebrated anniversaries, two years for John and Kandy Hughling and one year for Dick and Olivia Krull. A few minutes later we really struck gold as the Pine Mountain Choice Award was given to Mel & Lois Thomason for their pristine 1996 convertible.

Finally, the club participation awards were handed out. The Tulsa Vette Set, who always wins, won again with 41 cars. LSCC finished second with 34 cars registered. If memory serves me, and it does not always, this is the closest we have ever come to winning. We might have a shot next year, if everyone registers.

As soon as the show ended, most of the LSCC members drove out to their stops on the poker run route. It was awesome seeing so many Corvettes moving very quickly, to say the least, from stop to stop on some really curve filled roads south of Eureka Springs. The card stops were swamped at times. We later found out why, 155 Corvettes entered the poker run. That is an increase of almost 50 over last year. All in all, everything went very well. That is a tribute to Dick and Olivia and all of the volunteers (especially card hand checker Jimmy Stahr).

Not much partying at the pool on Saturday, as the poker run took up the partying time. Those who were back by 8:00 were treated to the parade of the champions. Several LSCC cars what won awards participated and received a huge cheer as they passed our hotel.

That pretty much ended the fun in Eureka Springs for this trip. On Sunday morning people left in small groups at different times headed home. As they drove out of Eureka Springs, they were probably thinking about good friends, great cars, great roads......

WANTED

INTERESTED AND WILLING TO SERVE

It's that time of year again when the Club membership will nominate officers for the next year. **All officer positions are open for nomination. The offices in RED** are currently held by officers who will have completed the maximum two years of service in their respective positions.

According to the LSCC ByLaws:

The term of office for officers will be not more than two full, consecutive terms. Partial terms are not counted as part of a full term.

Officers will be nominated in October and November, voted on in December, and installed into office in January (except the Classic Officer-elect as noted in the bylaws), and will serve for one calendar year. To be nominated for a position on the Board of Directors, either elected or appointed, the candidate must be a full member for twelve months prior to the nomination month.

Nominations for officers will be made from the floor by the membership at the October and November business meetings, or in writing to an officer prior to the November meeting.

The following is a brief summary of Officer Positions. Complete details can be found in the Bylaws on the Club website.

President: Preside over business and Board of Director meetings, serve as Chairman of the BOD. Appoint committees as necessary to meet the needs of the club. Maintain and develop relationships with: Club Sponsor, General Motors, National Corvette Museum and other clubs. Provide planning strategies that support LSCC's welfare and future success.

Vice President: Preside at the Board of Director and business meeting in the absence of the President. Arrange and schedule monthly business and BOD meetings and assist the President when required. Coordinate charitable activities. Maintain, update and coordinate BOD job descriptions. Maintain storage of LSCC documents and records.

Competitive Events Officer: Organize car shows, in town and out of town. Organize participation in racing activities – drag racing, autocross and rallies. Coordinate participation in NCRS activities. Distribute cruise night activity information.

Recreational Events Officer: Organize car displays. Coordinate road trips.

Recording Secretary: Keep the minutes of the business and Board of Directors meetings and will submit same to the Board of Directors and the business meeting minutes to the newsletter editor. Maintain all written communications for the club. Maintain the club Bylaws.

Membership Officer: Process and maintain all applications for membership and membership records. Publish the annual printed membership directory.

Financial Officer: Maintain an accurate accounting of all financial transactions. Provide monthly financial statements. Develop an annual budget.

Treasurer: Responsible for all payments and deposits of funds. Supervise the purchasing and sale of merchandise. Supervise all raffles.

Newsletter Editor: Produce the Club monthly newsletter.

Classic Officer: Manage the Classic administration and logistical support. Oversee the operation of the event itself.

Technical Officer: Maintain the Club website. Maintain records that measure event effectiveness.



2016 Printed Directory Goes to Press Soon! Will You Be Included?






