

#### **Seeking Corvettes for Display**

The National Corvette Museum regularly rotates out cars that are on display so no two visits are the same! The Museum is in search of rare colored Corvettes (limited production, original colors) to exhibit, and most cars stay on display for one year. Examples include a 1957-59 Inca Silver, 1960 Cascade Green, 1977 Corvette Chartreuse, 1990 Competition Yellow, 1994 Copper Metallic, 1996 Dark Purple Metallic, 2000-2001 Bowling Green, Aztec Gold, 1998 Navy Blue Metallic, etc. Information on displaying your car is online, and if you have a car that fits our criteria, please fill out a display application and attach a photo for consideration. Applications can also be obtained online or by calling Betty at 270/467-8841.

As an aside to the Museum's notice for Corvettes to display, even though it might not be a rare color, the NCM will likely be interested in your car for a future exhibit.

They will likely need all models of C-1s through C-4s in pristine condition. In addition, if you own a special edition C-5 or C-6, such as a Z06 GT1 or a Pace Car you are an excellent candidate. If a year seems too long, keep in mind many displays are only for three months.

#### **Museum Experience Program Enhanced**

Similar to R8C, the NCM Experience offers a day in the spotlight with your Corvette. It includes VIP Plant and Museum tours, a one-year individual Museum membership, commemorative plaque, silver decal and a photograph in front of the Museum. Experience Corvettes also receive an exterior cleaning and are placed on display on Corvette Boulevard. New to the program are the addition of several perks, including a numbered Flint brick, dealer brochure for your year of Corvette (if available), C-Magic sample pack and the opportunity to discuss maintenance tips and seek advice from our Vehicle Maintenance and Preservation Department. NCM Experiences are viewable on the Museum's webcams and the fee to participate is \$500. To schedule your Experience, contact Shane at 270/777-4505 or e-mail shane@corvettemuseum.org.

# Competitive

Our **Autocross** is at Brookhaven College. The next one is on Aug 20<sup>th.</sup> If you were not at the last one you missed a special event. We had all seven generation of the corvette on track. The "Chicago box" gave everyone a fit. If you don't know what a "Chicago box" is, come out and ask one of us.

Speeds in *Autocross* are slower, in absolute terms, when compared to other forms of racing but the activity level, measured in discrete turns per minute, can be higher than even Formula One due to the large number of elements packed into each course. The donation is **\$15 per car**. Helmets are required but loaners are available.

**Drag Racing:** On summer break for now. Next event will be Sunday, Sept 11<sup>th</sup> at Wichita Raceway Park - Iowa Park (Wichita Falls). Contact Allen Kaus at 972-467-0271 if you have any questions.

**Open Road Racers:** On Sept. 15<sup>th</sup> - 18<sup>th</sup>. the Silver State Classic Challenge, Inc., a non-profit corporation, closes State Route #318 between Lund and Hiko, Nevada with permits issued by the State of Nevada, for the running of these unique automotive events. The journey traverses 90 miles of a fenced two lane highway with long straights, twisty sections and dips. They do this event twice each year.

**Rally:** the club does not sponsor rallies at this time but I will tell you about the SCCA group that will be holding the "Clear Blue Sky" on **Saturday, Aug. 20th**.

The first Clear Blue Sky ended at an old airplane museum...no museums this time. You will start in McKinney, TX, take about a 125-mile drive on the beautiful paved roads of Collin County, with excursions into Grayson County, and end back in McKinney. This will be a typical SCCA Course Rally, but without set average speeds and timing checkpoints. To keep you on your toes, we will ask you to find certain signs along the route, and present you with some opportunities to take scenic alternate course loops. In this case we may ask you what road(s) you traveled on, if you saw a

specified road, or in which direction you turned. We will score you on how well you answer questions and follow the proper course. High scoring cars will win trophies.

- On-line registration is open now (but you already know that).
- The start location will be at Chrysler Jeep Dodge City of McKinney, 700 S Central Expy (US 75), McKinney, TX 75070. Take the Virginia exit off Central Expy, Exit 40A.
- The finish location is Rockfish Seafood Grill, 2780 S Central Expy, McKinney, TX 75070. This is on the northwest corner of Eldorado and S. Central Expy.
- Any four-wheel, street legal vehicle with two people who are old enough to read is eligible to enter.
- Entry fee: \$25.00. SCCA members get a \$5.00 discount. Preregistration here at MotorsportReg.com gets you the event rules early.

**HPDE**: Talk to Mike Krieger. This is **NOT RACING**. You drive at your own pace; instructors will not force you into an uncomfortable situation. This is performance driving education that will help you in your everyday driving and/or the next spirited drive you take.

The next tentative HPDE date for ECR will be Aug 13<sup>th</sup> pending the sale of the track.

The next PCA two day event at MSR Cresson will be in September 17 & 18. Registration opened July 18<sup>th,</sup>, so mark it on your calendar.

### Route 66, this time on the east side

You may recall in the LSCC <u>July issue</u> I wrote about the Herrick's and us running Route 66 from OK city west to Oatman AZ. This month Terri and I are running "66" from OK city east to Joliot IL. At the end of your first day (primarily sticking to only the back roads of Route 66) we stayed at a rustic well-kept original route 66 motel in Chandler OK. The 1939 vintage Lincoln Motel still has a section of the original concrete Mother Road







in front of the Motel. Rooms are small compared to today's standards (I guess they made people smaller back in the day), but now missing are the quarter slots for the vibrating bed and pay TV. For dinner that night, we sought out an old diner not far from the motel in the old section of town. The Boom-A-Rang Diner has great food and lots of early wall art to give your dining experience a real '50's flavor. This is a "Mikey's" recommended stop for a meal when passing through Chandler. There are also a couple of other Kodak spots right before and after getting into town. You can find a complete slideshow of our "66 East" trip here.

Things to look for as you travel east from Chandler are the Ribbon or Sidewalk Hwy; a 15 mile section of the original Mother Road that was used from 1922 to 1937. This section of road was only built 9 feet wide; cars were much narrower back then. Also watch

for the DX Gas Station and Packard Museum in Afton OK; a good place for a pit stop, stretch the legs and looks at some old Packard's. As you can tell, I'm a little partial to old gas stations. It must be the Petroleum Transfer Engineer still in my blood from the '60's when I worked at a Chevron Station pumping gas and driving a tow truck for the National Auto Club. I did my homework prior to leaving and tried my best to find all the old stations along Rte 66 but still managed to miss a couple as we jumped from



one section of old 66 to another....I'll be returning to the Mother Road once again in the future to track down the rest of them.






The last POI stop of the first day came just before Springfield MO.; this was the small town (wide spot in the road) of Spencer MO. Spencer has been resurrected from the dead by a married couple over several years to look as it does today. This was another very cool Kodak moment along the 66 Hwy.

We spent the second night at a modern hotel in Springfield MO and toured the Fantastic Caverns just outside of town the following morning. We have explored several caverns across this nation and I must give two thumbs up for this one. It's the only cave that you will not walk through; instead, you will ride in a Jeep drawn trailer for the hour long tour of the cave. This cave, unlike several others we have toured, is very much alive with limestone formations still growing throughout the cave. One of the most awesome formations was this pair of columns that reached some 15 feet or more from floor to ceiling. It takes some 75 years for the limestone to grow one centimeter....you do the math here, lots of zeros to get to this size.

If you're ready for a night's stay half way across MO., I would recommend the Munger Moss Motel in Lebanon. It's very well-kept and quite reasonably priced. We are planning on trying to stay there on the return trip. A second Historic Route 66 Motel is on the west side of town, the Route 66 Inn, just as nice and well-kept.

Out of the 49 states I have traveled through, Missouri is one of my favorite with its rolling green hills and exposed limestone rock outcroppings, I believe it is one of the prettiest states to travel or live in. We really enjoyed driving the back roads of Missouri, taking advantage of wandering roads through the countryside. It was tuff picking out our future home setting from the many seen along Route 66.





In the small town of Fanning you can find the world's largest rocker next to the Fanning General Store. Just down the road toward Cuba MO is Bob's Gas Station signs; this is a private collection covering several acers plus filling a large outbuilding. Bob welcomes photo takers of his property and will provide group tours with prior notice (donations appreciated).

Another great motel to spend the night at is just east of Cuba; The Wagon Wheel Motel is probably the best maintained motel in the pretest setting of all the Route 66 old motels. If you find yourself needing a place to stay just west of St. Louis, try to stay here....they also have a neat gas station out front and a good BBQ place next door!







Our time for the day's travel was running short, getting close to the 5 O'clock traffic jam around the big city of St. Louis, so we broke tradition and hit the interstate to traverse northward to Litchfield IL for our next night's stay. Believed to be the oldest restaurants on 66, Ariston in Litch-

field, was located on the original Hwy (1926) then moved a few streets west during one of the re-alignments and has been serving patrons ever since. We have eaten here three times over the years and can honestly state the food is great. Check out the T-shirts they have for sale before leaving; they have a great one with an early Corvette pictured in front of the store. Also across the street is a car



museum with good reviews. We have yet to walk through it due to incompatible arrival and departure times. But one Monday we purposely arrived early just so we could visit the museum only to find it was closed on Mondays.

The next "Mikey choice", do not miss towns is Atlanta IL, north of Lincoln. If you are ready to stretch your legs and enjoy a piece of pie, or take a Kodak moment and enjoy pie or are just hungry for a meal and pie, this is where you want to stop! The public Library is an old 8 sided stone building with a stone clock tower in front that needs to be hand wound every 8 days. Also check out the smiley face water tower, Giant Hot Dog Man, J.H. Hawes Grain Elevator Museum, The Arcade Museum and The Palms Café; did I mention they have awesome homemade pies here? And the food prices are very reasonable! This is another stop you will want to plan around meal time....and when in the Palms Café, make sure you make a trip to the restroom and check out all the old B&W photos on the walls in the back dining room, I love this place!



A small town north of Atlanta is Odel, where you can find the old Miller Standard Oil Station; be sure to pick-up a pamphlet and read the history of this station...very interesting! Like most of the 66 stops, this gas station sells some neat T-shirts with pictures of the station on the front.

Still traveling north on 66, many other old stations can be found along with other major points of interest. The past several trips we have used "EZ 66 Guide for Travelers". This book is a must if you want to find all the great Kodak moments and learn some of the history of the Mother Road from Chicago to Santa Monica. The book can also be found on Amazon or at most of the 66 stops and museums from just under \$20 to \$25.



You will need a minimum of 4 to 5 full days of travel time to run the western or eastern section of 66 from OKC and see most of the POI's listed in 66 Guide for Traveler's. If you want to see everything listed in the book, plan on a 3 week trip from end to end. Keep in mind, over the years Route 66 has moved several times as small rural towns grew into larger towns then became busy cities. In towns such as Litchfield, you can see 4 different revisions of route 66; 3 of them can be seen while standing in one spot.





If you are planning a trip down the Mother Hwy and need some help or suggestions on putting your trip together, catch me at a club function or drop me <u>a line</u> with your questions. We've run Rte. 66 three times now and have seen most of the good stuff.
