## Open Road Racing

Open road racing starts on Jan. $2^{\text {nd }}$ with registration into the Big Bend Open Road Race. The dates for the race are April 19th - 22nd. Mark your calendar. Talk to Mike Black, open road racing coordinator and past winner of this event. He will stress to you the importance of registering early ( 1 minute after midnight) as there are only a limited number of competitors.
The 2017 BBORR takes place on US Highway 285 South from Fort Stockton to Sanderson and back (about 59.0 miles each way - or 118.0 miles). This part of the road is closed by the police for the racers. Sit back, buckle up and get ready for the ride of a lifetime. There are different classes of racers depending on the speed you want to average over this distance. Speed classes start at a boring 85 MPH all the way to unlimited. When we traveled to Vets and Jets this last September, I took the group down I130 at about 100 miles per hour. The smile on everyone's face at the end was something to see so I know this is not hard for our cars to do this and the speed classes go all the way up to unlimited for the ones that are experienced. This event alone brings in hundreds of people to these small West Texas communities from all over the U.S. and Europe.
This year's Big Bend Open Road Race will have something for everyone, so make plans now to be a part of this exciting event in West Texas. The event starts off in Sanderson on Wednesday, and Thursday with activities for the racers including registration, technical inspection, rookie school, practice runs, and qualifying. A Welcome Party will be held on Thursday at 5 p.m.
On Friday, the activities move to Fort Stockton for additional racer functions and a Car Show from 4:00 p.m. - 5:30 p.m. in Rooney Park. Everyone is invited to come and meet the drivers and see their cars.
On Saturday, the Annual After Race Party in the Park will be held in Rooney Park from 12:30-5:30 p.m. The racers will end up here after they cross the finish line. There will be music, food, and drinks and lot and lots of FUN!!! ## LSCC 2017 Big Trip - "Sunshine Tour"


t seemed appropriate to name the 2017 trip after the "Sunshine State" as noted on many of the Florida license plates. We are planning to leave Thursday, March 9, and returning Monday, March $20^{\text {th }}$. In the interest of saving space in the monthly newsletter, I plan to highlight a few of the trip's points of interest each month. Since announcing the trip at the November meeting, many folks are contributing great ideas and I am working to tighten up the trip routing and itinerary. For those just starting to hear about the trip, we will be heading southeast to Florida with trip's ultimate destination being Key West ("Its 5:00 somewhere") and we plan to see a lot of cool things along the way. For those who like to get their day started a little early, we can head over to tour the USS Alabama, allowing the sleeper inners another $2-21 / 2$ hours while we take a self-guided tour. Once onboard, we can enter gun turrets, view crew's quarters, sick bay, an engine room and much more. There are 12 decks open for touring. There is a 15-minute film in the Uptake Theater featuring former WWII USS Alabama crewmen. After touring the Alabama, we head down to the $36,000 \mathrm{sq}$. ft. Aircraft Pavilion, dedicated to the 29 Medal of Honor recipients from the State of Alabama. There is an A-12 "Blackbird" Spy Plane and a P51-D Mustang Redtail, the type of plane flown by the valiant Tuskegee Airmen. Then check out other aircraft, a Vietnam PBR boat, and other wonderful exhibits. We can also take a ride in the Flight Simulator. Also the Submarine USS DRUM can be viewed from every vantage point, inside and out. If time allows, we can visit the inspiring Vietnam and Korean War Memorials also located in the park

[^0]0n Saturday, March 11, 2017, we will attend the Amelia's Cars \& Coffee at the Concours to view vintage, exotic, and collectible vehicles that gather on the same show field used to display vehicles entered in the following day's prestigious concours d'elegance. Unlike Sunday's main event that is limited to a select group of vehicles with unique historical significance specifically chosen to tell a thoughtfully-scripted story, Saturday's Cars \& Coffee at the Concours features a diverse group of vehicles that celebrate the auto-motive-enthusiast's spirit. Proud owners of beautiful collectible and exotic vehicles awake early, shine up their prized automobiles, drive to The Golf Club at Amelia Island and gather with like-minded enthusiasts on the first, tenth, and eighteenth fairways for a cup or two of fresh coffee. For those who are interested, there is an application process; showing a collectible car costs nothing and the event is free to the public from 9am to 1 pm . The Amelia Island Concours d’Elegance views Cars \& Coffee at the Concours as a gift to the community, a family-friendly "thank you" for supporting the event and making the award-winning show, now in its 22nd year, a reality. 0n Sunday, We will attend the Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance (AIC). For those who are unfamiliar with this event, it is an automotive charitable event held each year during the second weekend in March at The Ritz-Carlton Amelia Island in Amelia Island, Florida. A New York Times article about celebrity car ownership listed "the nation's top concours d'elegance: Pebble Beach in California, Meadow Brook in Michigan, Amelia Island in Florida and the Louis Vuitton Classic in midtown Manhattan."

A concours d'elegance (French, literally "a competition of elegance") is according to New York Times writer Keith Martin like a "beauty pageant for rare and elegant cars". Each entry is rated for authenticity, function, history, style and quality of restoration by a team of judges that includes specialists for each car type. A perfect score is 100, but any imperfection, no matter how slight, requires a fractional point deduction.

Classes are arranged by type, marque, coachbuilder, country of origin, or time period. Judges select first-, second-, and third-place finishers for each class in the event, and the judges confer the best of show award on one car from the group of first-place winners. In addition, a group of honorary judgestypically individuals who have made significant contributions to the automotive industry or motorsports-give subjective awards to recognize standout vehicles regardless of class ribbons, as well as memorial awards created to honor automotive industry personages.

Here is a little History about this extraordinary event. Businessman and car collector Bill Warner, a photographer and writer for Road \& Track magazine since 1971, founded the Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance in 1996 at the urging of other northeast Florida auto enthusiasts who wanted a classic car show in Florida like the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance in California. Warner selected Community Hospice of Northeast Florida, which had provided service to his parents as well as his wife, as the beneficiary of the event. The first event was held April 6, 1996 at Ritz-Carlton Amelia Island. Warner assembled a group of 163 cars and attendance was around 2,200.

By 1999 attendance had increased to 8,500; 205 cars were exhibited; and $\$ 268,000$ was raised for Community Hospice. The New York Times assigned a reporter to write a story. In his full-page feature article, Keith Martin stated, "The Amelia Island event, which is sponsored by Mercedes-Benz, is the only one in its region to aspire to the same standard of excellence (as the) Concours d'Elegance at Pebble Beach, in California, as well as the Louis Vuitton Classic at Rockefeller Center".
Entrants submit an application for each car, and the Concours field is selected from each year's pool of applicants. Many collectors spend years and hundreds of thousands of dollars purchasing and restoring a car in hopes of being chosen. Once a car is accepted to the Concours, it cannot again be entered in the event for five years, with three exceptions; the ownership of the car has changed, the car has been restored, or if the featured marque is obscure, the Concours car selection committee can reach out to invite cars of varying restoration quality-or cars that have previously been entered in the Concours-in order to provide a healthy representation of the marque for exhibition.
Many of the competing cars are valued in the hundreds of thousands of dollars, with some worth millions. For this reason, along with its setting and amenities, the Amelia Island Concours is considered one of the premier concours in the world.

Have you ever wanted to drive flat out down a winding state highway, safely, with the Highway Patrol's help? Of course, you have - everyone has and now you can do all that and much, much more

The Big Bend Open Road Race is the event to experience it all. It is much more than the race itself. It's the total overall experience that has something for everyone. The socializing at night at the hotel is wonderful.
