With the beginning of the New Year, the NCM's Calendar of Events is just about set for 2017. So, this month we will provide at list and describe the ones that are coming up soon.

But first, thanks to all of you who make it a Merry Christmas at the National Corvette Museum by becoming members during our "free brick" promotion. The latest LSCC members to join the Museum family are: Phil Adams, John Glennie, Don Stewart.

The NCM grew by seven memberships from our club during the last three months.

Now, about the great NCM events planned for this year. Fourteen events are on the schedule. Five are at the Museum and a record nine are Museum in Motion events. The MiM's are similar to our club trips, to interesting locations across the country. Among the destinations this year are Tennessee, California, Utah and Florida.

The NCM Bash is the first, and arguably the best event at the Museum this year. What makes it so great is that it marks the rollout of the next model year Corvette, the place where you can see them up close and in detail. Bash 2017 will provide enthusiasts the chance to see the new 2018 Corvette Stingray up close as well as getting all the latest information about the 7th Generation Corvette. Seminars will feature speakers discussing 'What's new in the 2018 model year, as well as using your 7th generation navigation system. As in past years there will be a large contingent of GM engineers and designers from Warren Tech Center, and the Bowling Green Assembly Plant ready to answer your every question.

If there is truth to the rumors about a new ZR1, or a midengine Corvette, this is where you will see and touch it.

A special one-time event at this year's Bash will be the Corvette Racing recognition dinner. This will honor Doug Fehan, Gary Pratt, Jim Miller and all of Corvette Racing for their many successes, including their 100th victory and IMSA championship this year. If you are a fan of Corvette racing this is a not to miss opportunity. Most, if not all of the Corvette Racing team will be there.

The Bash is April 27-29, in Bowling Green. We have some rooms blocked for LSCC. If you are interested, I will send you reservation information.

If all I have described is not quite enough to get your commitment, how about the Bash, followed immediately by a cruise to eastern Tennessee to drive the famous Tail of the Dragon with 318 curves in 11 miles. Then follow that with two days at the beautiful Biltmore Estate in Asheville, NC. All you have to do is register for the Museum in Motion Dragon Run. Open Road Racing

Open road racing starts on Jan. 2nd with registration into the Big Bend Open Road Race. The dates for the race are April 19th - 22nd. Mark your calendar. Talk to Mike Black, open road racing coordinator and past winner of this event. He will stress to you the importance of registering early (1 minute after midnight) as there are only a limited number of competitors.

The 2017 BBORR takes place on US Highway 285 South from Fort Stockton to Sanderson and back (about 59.0 miles each way - or 118.0 miles). This part of the road is closed by the police for the racers. Sit back, buckle up and get ready for the ride of a lifetime. There are different classes of racers depending on the speed you want to average over this distance. Speed classes start at a boring 85MPH all the way to unlimited. When we traveled to Vets and Jets this last September, I took the group down I130 at about 100 miles per hour. The smile on everyone's face at the end was something to see so I know this is not hard for our cars to do this and the speed classes go all the way up to unlimited for the ones that are experienced. This event alone brings in hundreds of people to these small West Texas communities from all over the U.S. and Europe.

This year's Big Bend Open Road Race will have something for everyone, so make plans now to be a part of this exciting event in West Texas. The event starts off in Sanderson on Wednesday, and Thursday with activities for the racers including registration, technical inspection, rookie school, practice runs, and qualifying. A Welcome Party will be held on Thursday at 5 p.m.

On Friday, the activities move to Fort Stockton for additional racer functions and a Car Show from 4:00 p.m. – 5:30 p.m. in Rooney Park. Everyone is invited to come and meet the drivers and see their cars.

On Saturday, the Annual After Race Party in the Park will be held in Rooney Park from 12:30 – 5:30 p.m. The racers will end up here after they cross the finish line. There will be music, food, and drinks and lot and lots of FUN!!! Everyone is invited to come out and see the cars, take pictures, get autographs, etc. *Don't miss out on this racing event.* www.bborr.com

High Performance Driving Education

These events continue through the winter season but as always you have to register well in advance. The morning starts out with a driver's meeting. Drivers are already preassigned into one of three or four different levels of run groups (pending event) with in-car instructors assigned accordingly. Each run group has instructional classes each day in-between their 4 to 5 on-track run sessions over the course of the day. Each time a Beginner or Novice driver goes on the track they will have an assigned instructor seated beside them for live feedback, guidance, instruction and evaluation at the end of the course to be able to further guide us in serving your performance driving needs. This is a great way to learn about your car and what it and you can do!

All other competitive events are done for the season and will start again in the spring.

St. Augustine is brimming with nearly 500 years of history. For those who wish to see it all and soak in as much of the city's fascinating heritage as possible, we have a private 1 hour, 8 mile, narrated tour with the Old Town Trolley Tour Company. The Old Town Trolley Tour takes you to all of the most important historic sights. After the narrated tour, you will be allowed to get off as often as you wish and spend as long as you want to investigate points of interest to you. Points of interest are the Fountain of Youth, the City Gates, the Spanish Quarter, historic St. George Street, Castillo de San Marcos, Flagler Memorial Presbyterian Church, Grace United Methodist Church and so much more.
