

The Lone Star Corvette Club is dedicated to the Corvette lifestyle and the people that own them.
Our Club slogan says it all:

Good Friends... Great Cars!

Founded in 1982, the Club now has over 1,000 members – each with his/her own story to tell of how they found that perfect "Vette." Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, it offers just about any activity an owner of "America's Sports Car" could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, DragRacing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

Road Trips – The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. A large group recently returned from a nine-day caravan to Vettes on the Rockies held in Winter Park, Colorado. Past trips have taken us to the Black Hills of South Dakota, the Barrett Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the National Corvette Museum's 15th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

Day Trips – Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members' garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other's company.

Open Road Racing – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just "click" on "Open Road Racing".

Drag Racing – Another "go fast" group within the Club are the Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplexfor trophies and bragging rights. Many members –both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Drag Racing</u>".

Autocross – Others in the Club prefer to sharpen their driving skills by competing in Autocross. An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just "click" on "Autocross".

NCRS – Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just "click" on "NCRS".

Car Shows – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or an out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in the Dallas Autorama. On the first Saturday of each month, you'll find a bunch of us at Cars & Coffee in Plano, "kicking tires" and telling tall tales about our cars.

Displays and Parades – The public loves to look at our Corvettes. Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a large contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We've been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway's oval before races. Christmas finds us backing up the bikers in the Great Texas Toy Run that benefits thousands of needy children in the area. The Dallas Veterans' Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

Lone Star Corvette Classic – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the "Classic" attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US and Canada. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including judged and Show N Shine indoor car shows, a variety of automotive vendors, good food, and exciting track events held on the Texas Motor Speedway's oval and road course.

100% of the net proceeds from the Classic go to support the Club's two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children's Charities, and a third charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members.

Club Meetings – The Club meets on the second Saturday of each month at various locations around the Metroplex. We would love to have you come to a meeting and "check us out."

I'd like to encourage you to further explore our website. A glimpse at the Club's Event Calendar will give you a good overview of just how active and diverse our Club is. Just "click" on "Event Calendar".

Proud to be a Texan...

You know those monster trucks that hurtle down the highway? The ones about which we, in our sleek sports cars, might mutter a few unkind words?

Hurricane Harvey barged into the lives of millions of Texans recently, and he overstayed his welcome. Much of the Texas gulf coast was deluged with high winds and massive flooding. As fast as the floodwaters began holding residents hostage, the citizens jumped into action to help each other. Texans demonstrated on the world stage that they are self-reliant people who wait for no one when neighbors are in need. Almost simultaneously, something called the Cajun Navy, a group nearly 200 of Louisiana's finest ordinary citizens with boats, were on the way to help. One TV report of a rural citizen told of awakening in the night to flood water in the house. Already aware that his overextended sheriff's department was unable to respond befor daylight, this flood victim placed a call to the Cajun Navy. He and his family were rescued within 30-minutes.

An amazing group of Texans, organized by *CP Offroad* in Tomball, TX, rained down on SE Texas with 200 boats, 300 trucks (yeah, those monster trucks mentioned above) and 600 volunteers from around our state. That number swelled with people bringing boats from around the country just to help. A Houston mother of two toddlers used her laptop computer to devise a network between pleas for help on social media to a volunteer rescue dispatch center. And, what can you say about JJ Watt raising over \$37 Million?

With the urgency and precision of a Jan Magnussen C7R pit stop, these volunteers worked in concert with local, state, and federal rescue partners to provide a simply amazing response that was far more robust than leaving it to those agencies alone. If this whole Harvey experience doesn't reassure your faith in humanity and your pride in Texas, nothing will.

Lifetime Members

On the first night of the celebration the Museum honored its Lifetime Members with a dinner in the NCM Conference Center. Awards

On the first day of the celebration a lunch was held for NCM ambassadors. Awards were presented for best newsletters and websites. Of the many clubs entered LSCC won Third Place – Best Newsletter, a great honor.

A number of Master Ambassador awards were presented. These have a lot to do with museum membership and support from the Ambassadors' club. Thanks to LSCC Johnny and Edie Downs received their 13th consecutive Master Ambassador award.


The next two day event at MSR Cresson will be October 7-8. Registration is open.....mark it on your calendar.

New Coordinators Needed!


It's time for you to get involved!

LSCC Bylaws, Section XII, Article 5 is Revised

- E. The duties of the Recreational Events Officer will include, but not be limited to:
- 1. Coordinate road trips, including trips to car shows with a primary emphasis of fund raising and/or recreation. In the event the nature of the event is ambiguous, the Club President shall make the decision whether responsibility of the event is Recreational of Competitive.
- 2. Coordinate car displays.
- 3. Coordinate dinner cruises.
- 4. Coordinate swap meets, detail days, shade tree events, etc.
- 5. Ensure that Club insurance requirements are met for Club sanctioned events that meet coverage criteria as outlined by the Club's insurance carrier. This includes ensuring that event coordinators complete the required Independent Club Event Liability (ICEL) forms and collect the required, current, properly formatted, and signed waivers from event participants. The Recreational Events Officer will submit the completed ICEL to the insurance agent and ensure that all documents are delivered to the Recording Secretary for archival.









A HPDE Track Day at Eagles Canyon Raceway is planned for the Lone Star Corvette Club on November 4, 2017. Eagles Canyon will have a group just for women including classes and track time with instructors.

Here is the catch. To keep this a "LSCC MEMBERS ONLY" event, we needs commitments from a minimum of 35 drivers (men & women). LSCC needs 12 to 15 ladies to make a "Girls Only" group. The current price is \$200 per person which includes water, sports drinks, and snacks during the day plus lunch. We will run Beginner, Experienced, Instructors, and Women's sessions. 








With no further business to discuss, the Business meeting was adjourned at 12:40 p.m.





