

Just bought a new Corvette? Or just love them? Welcome, you've come to the right place! The Lone Star Corvette Club is dedicated to the Corvette lifestyle and the people that own them. Our Club slogan says it all:

Good Friends... Great Cars!

Founded in 1982, the Club now has over 1,000 members – each with his/her own story to tell of how they found that perfect "Vette." Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, it offers just about any activity an owner of "America's Sports Car" could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, DragRacing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

Road Trips – Want to explore the wide open road? The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. A large group recently returned from a caravan to Eureka Springs, Arkansas, winning the club participation event at the show. Past trips have taken us to the Upper Pennisula of Michigan, the Barrett Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the National Corvette Museum's 15th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

Day Trips – Want to enjoy North Texas? Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members' garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other's company.

Open Road Racing – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just"click" on "<u>Open Road Racing</u>".

Drag Racing – Want to "go fast"? Join the club Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplexfor trophies and bragging rights. Many members –both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Drag Racing</u>".

Autocross – Want to sharpen your driving skills? Try autocross! An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Autocross</u>".

NCRS – Want your older model corvette to be an accurate icon? Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just "click" on "<u>NCRS</u>".

Car Shows – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or an out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in the Dallas Autorama.

Displays and Parades – Looking to share the Corvetter spirit? Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a large contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We've been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway's oval before races. Christmas finds us backing up the bikers in the Great Texas Toy Run that benefits thousands of needy children in the area. The Dallas Veterans' Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

Lone Star Corvette Classic – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the "Classic" attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US and Canada. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including judged and Show N Shine indoor car shows, a variety of automotive vendors, good food, and exciting track events held on the Texas Motor Speedway's oval and road course. 100% of the net proceeds from the Classic go to support the Club's two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children's Charities, and a third charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members.

Club Meetings – We want you! The Club meets on the second Saturday of each month at various locations around the Metroplex. We would love to have you come to a meeting and "check us out." I'd like to encourage you to further explore our website. A glimpse at the Club's Event Calendar will give you a good overview of just how active and diverse our Club is. Dollie Cole Inducted Into the Corvette Hall of Fame

Dollie Cole, long time friend and supporter of Lone Star Corvette Club, has been elected to the Corvette Hall of Fame and will be inducted during the 25th NCM Anniversary after the Caravan this August. She was elected in the Enthusiast category, and if you saw her at our Lone Star Classic you will agree that she was the enthusiast's enthusiast.

In 2000, Dollie was Chairman of the Board of the NCM. In that year Stephanie Morrill, NCM Membership Manager, secured Dollie's attendance as a celebrity guest at our Lone Star Classic. This was the first of many annual trips by Dollie to support our Classic until her passing in 2014. She set the tone on that first trip. The night she arrived, we took her to dinner. Not only did she refuse our attempt to pick up the check, but she paid the entire bill. She also demanded her hotel be billed to her, not the club, as was planned.

In all the years Dollie Cole attended the Classic, LSCC never paid a dime of her expenses. She said in no uncertain terms that she was there to help the club raise funds for charity, not take money from our causes.

Typically, when Dollie came to the Classic, she brought a former Corvette Racing 18-wheeler, with a huge awning, driven by her son Nick. It was used for autocross and Sunday track events. She also brought many items for our silent auction, and being the gueen of shopping, she also spent quite a lot on purchases at the auctions, supporting our charities.

Dollie also brought a love for her "Corvette family". She made a point to befriend hundreds over the years. When making her Dollie Cole Choice at the Classic car show, she took it very seriously. Not only did she look at the cars, but she spoke with the owners learning their stories. This resulted in really great choices.

LSCC was honored to write a letter to the NCM supporting Dollie's nomination to the Hall of Fame. Upon her election we received a letter of thanks from Dollie's daughter Anne Cole Pierce.

As described in the National Corvette Museum announcement, Dollie Ann Cole was a force of nature. Although she was happily married to Ed Cole, President of General Motors, she was never content with just being the auto executive's wife. She instead gained a reputation as a respected businessperson, a staunch defender of the automobile industry, and a strong supporter of Corvette.

Colorful and outspoken, she lived life to the fullest, doing everything from being a model, to becoming an accredited test driver and pilot, as well as the Senior Editor for a publishing company. She was also known for getting things done when no one else could. When privateer racing efforts got stuck, sometimes all it took to get some clandestine support from GM engineering was to let Dollie know about it.

Dollie also provided leadership for several charitable organizations in support of disabled people, children, animals, and families of fallen officers. She served on several national and local boards, including PBS, The Smithsonian National Air and Space Museum, and the National Corvette Museum, where she presided as its Chair in 2000 and 2001.

"Dollie took her position on the board very seriously," Museum Executive Director Wendell Strode remembers. "When the Museum was really struggling, she pushed for a new business plan against strong opposition. She leveraged her contacts in corporate America and GM to open doors to find ways to generate revenue for the Museum. She hosted some large fundraising events for us, and on more than one occasion she would even write a check so that we could be involved in some activity that would make us more visible locally and nationally. Dollie was very proud of her affiliation with the National Corvette Museum. She worked hard to get others excited, involved, and proud of the Museum that represented America's sports car."

The other Hall of Fame nominees for this year are Briggs Cunningham in the Racing category and Tom Peters for GM/Chevrolet.

NCM Raffles

The Museum has temporarily suspended the sale of raffle tickets outside of Kentucky.

A person not affiliated with NCM notified the Museum that it is illegal to sell tickets outside of Kentucky with only a Kentucky gaming license. Whether this is true or not, the Museum must err on the side of caution. So, until further notice, raffle tickets will only be sold to visitors to the Museum, or by phone or online to residents of Kentucky.

In the meantime, the NCM is investigating the claim. In addition, the museum will determine which states accept the Kentucky gaming license and will investigate the process and cost of obtaining approval in states that do not. The hope is that this issue will be resolved shortly.

NCM Bash April 25-27

Another reason to attend the Bash - you can purchase raffle tickets there!

Kickoff of the 2019 NCM on site event season, the Bash traditionally marks the roll out of the next model year Corvette, the place you can see them up close and in detail. Bash 2019 will provide enthusiasts a chance to see and touch the new 2020 corvette. Based on the total lack of information from Chevrolet on the "C8", the 2020 could be the last C7. Whether C7 or C8 the new 2020 will be the centerpiece of the Bash.

Lone Star Classic - LSCC / NCRS Registration To register for the Classic as an NCRS participant for the Texas Chapter NCRS Judging for either Flight Judging or Concours Judging.

You will need to first register on the LSCC registration form - after you select either "Judged " or " Show & Shine " you will receive a question about NCRS participation. Complete the LSCC registration. The next step is to complete an NCRS online registration. Go to https://www.ncrs.org/ | NCRS | National Corvette Restorers Society. and select " Services " - Coming Events - Event Registration - then scroll down to Texas Chapter Meet 5-18-19. Log in and complete the NCRS registration form.

Total Corvette registration for this event is (8) cars. The NCRS cars will be grouped together at a location under the TMS grandstands.

The Concours Judging Program is a new venue that allows Corvettes with modifications to participate in the NCRS judging activities. Many of these modified Corvettes are well presented but would not fare well under the traditional Flight Judging system; thus, owners now have an avenue for display and judging. Modified Corvettes will be judged in two categories - Stock Division and Modified Division. The Stock Division offers two awards (Blue Ribbon and Red Ribbon) while the Modified Division also offers two awards (427 Award and 327 Award). Full details on the registration process are not yet available, and I should have them for the next newsletter. Probably both NCRS and LSCC registration will be required.

Throughout history, there have been more officers killed in the line of duty in the State of Texas than in any other state or territory. In 2018 we lost eleven officers, these brave men and women show up every day to protect us, not because it's their job, but because it is a calling!

The TXFallen Tribute Event began in 2008 as a police bike race honoring the lives of Texas officers killed in the line of duty. Over the years it has grown into a community fund raising event benefit-ting the Texas Police Chiefs Association Foundation. Through this their Officer Death Benefit Fund provides monetary assistance within 24 hours to the families of officers working in Texas who die in the line of duty. In 2018 they were able to provide each family with a check for \$5000 to help with immediate financial needs.

The bike race and event takes place each fall at the shops of Highland Village in Highland Village Texas. The 2019 dates for the event have not been finalized. Corvette Magnetic Ride Control Upgrade

As described in an announcement by Chevrolet Performance, Corvette development engineers have new tools which help them better analyze Magnetic Ride Control (MRC) data recorded on the bench, on the road, and on the track. These tools have resulted in major improvements in Tour, Sport, and Track modes for all MRC vehicles. The improvements are so significant that all 2019 MRC Corvettes will include the new calibration.

Chevrolet Performance is now making these new calibrations available to all customers already in possession of a 2014-2018 7th Generation Corvette with MRC. These upgrades greatly improve ride quality and handling feel, and have been rigorously validated and tested to ensure all chassis systems work together.

Each Tour, Sport, and Track calibration is independently tuned for its respective chassis. The new calibrations exhibit a much more refined balance of the heave, pitch, roll, wheel, handling, and temperature compensation algorithms. In Tour and Sport Modes the driver will feel major improvements in impact isolation and integration. Ride motion and balance are also greatly enhanced. Parking lot and low-speed (25 mph and less) ride motions are more compliant and less jarring. Sport mode also improves the handling precision and balance. Like Tour mode, Sport mode will exhibit the same impact and body motion improvements over the original Sport mode. In Track mode, the balance and response to driver inputs are more linear, and vehicle dynamics, based on throttle response, have been greatly improved. Drivers should notice more linear behavior near and at the limit of adhesion.

For 2015and 2016 Z06 customers who have the Z07 package, there is an option to update the Tour and Sport calibrations and keep the original Track calibration.

For 2018 vehicles, <u>some</u> of the final improvements for MRC upgrades were part of the 2018 production release. Thus, the improvements for 2018 vehicles are also very significant but not quite as dramatic as the 2014 to 2017 packages.

As the owner of a 2016 Stingray with MRC, I was more than a little curious about this upgrade, which is priced at \$350. So I contacted my service advisors at The Thompson Group at Classic Chevrolet and made an appointment to do the software re-flash. The upgrade was downloaded directly from Chevrolet Performance via a high-speed data link. It took less than an hour from the time the car was pulled into the service bay. I was able to drive the car back home with instructions to allow the vehicle to sit for 8 to 10 hours prior to "spirited driving". The need for this is in the service bulletin as – The MRC damper system has a built-in temperature offset correction as part of the calibration. Allowing the vehicle to sit will allow the damper temperature offset in the calibration to accurately reset. The vehicle is still functional prior to sitting for 8-10 hours; however, the temperature offset correction will be less accurate, resulting in a less optimized operation until the damper temperatures normalize.

I am happy to report that the recalibration does improve the ride and handling of our Stingray in Tour and Sport modes as described above. We rarely drive our Stingray on a track or on the street in Track mode, so please report your own results of that when you have your MRC update installed.

What special skills are needed to fulfill your duties?




How much time does it take each month for you to do club business?


