Just bought a new Corvette? Or just love them? Welcome, you've come to the right place! The Lone Star Corvette Club is dedicated to the Corvette lifestyle and the people that own them. Our Club slogan says it all:

Founded in 1982, the Club now has over 1,000 members – each with his/her own story to tell of how they found that perfect "Vette." Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, it offers just about any activity an owner of "America's Sports Car" could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, DragRacing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

Road Trips – Want to explore the wide open road? The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. A large group recently returned from a caravan to Eureka Springs, Arkansas, winning the club participation event at the show. Past trips have taken us to the Upper Pennisula of Michigan, the Barrett Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the National Corvette Museum's 15th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

Day Trips – Want to enjoy North Texas? Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members' garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other's company.

Open Road Racing – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just"click" on "<u>Open Road Racing</u>".

Drag Racing – Want to "go fast"? Join the club Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplexfor trophies and bragging rights. Many members –both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Drag Racing</u>".

Autocross – Want to sharpen your driving skills? Try autocross! An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Autocross</u>".

NCRS – Want your older model corvette to be an accurate icon? Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just "click" on "<u>NCRS</u>".

Car Shows – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or an out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in Dallas Autorama.

Displays and Parades – Looking to share the Corvetter spirit? Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a large contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We've been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway's oval before races. Christmas finds us backing up the bikers in the Great Texas Toy Run that benefits thousands of needy children in the area. The Dallas Veterans' Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

Lone Star Corvette Classic – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the "Classic" attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US and Canada. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including judged and Show N Shine indoor car shows, a variety of automotive vendors, good food, and exciting track events held on the Texas Motor Speedway's oval and road course. 100% of the net proceeds from the Classic go to support the Club's two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children's Charities, and a third charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members.

Club Meetings – We want you! The Club meets on the second Saturday of each month at various locations around the Metroplex. We would love to have you come to a meeting and "check us out." Volunteers Needed

As has been the case for 20 years, the National Corvette Museum will have merchandise available at the Classic this month. Also, as has been the case for 20 years, volunteers are needed in the merchandise booth.

No experience is needed, just a desire to help the NCM. The major benefit is the opportunity to meet new Corvette friends and visit with old Corvette friends.

Collector Car Insurance

The other day one of our members mentioned a concern about their collector car insurance. As with most collector car policies, he had a mileage limit. I believe it was 3,000 miles. He was concerned because he is going on the NCM Caravan this August and might run over his limit. Fortunately, his policy is with NCM Insurance. He can raise his limit for this trip and lower it back to 3,000 next year. Mileage limits with NCM Insurance are available from 1,000 to 6,000 miles, and even unlimited.

Along this same line, another really great feature of NCM Insurance is rollover miles. An example of how this works is, let's say you have a 6,000 mile limit. You report your mileage at the beginning of the policy year, you only drive 5,000 miles, report your ending mileage and rollover 1,000 miles to the next year giving you 7,000.

Finally, probably the greatest feature of an NCM collector car policy is <u>agreed value</u>. An agreed value is established on the policy, and if there is a total loss you are paid that amount. If you have added dress-up accessories and/or wheels to your Corvette, at the very least you will have some difficulty collecting for those in the event of a loss on a "regular" policy. With agreed value add the cost of those items to the book value of the car up front. You will recover your investment, no questions asked, if a loss occurs.

In 2010, we switched three cars from regular auto insurance to NCM Collector Car coverage. Not only did we acquire the benefits I've mentioned, we saved over \$2,100 per year. 

Lone Star Classic

The Lone Star Classic is fast approaching. The NCRS Flight Judging program is **FULL**. If you were considering entering your Corvette for Flight or Concours judgling you should contact Ray Kimminau.

To register for the Classic as an NCRS participant for the Texas Chapter NCRS Judging for either Flight Judging or Concours Judging.

You will need to first register on the LSCC registration form - after you select either "Judged " or " Show & Shine " you will receive a question about NCRS participation. Complete the LSCC registration. The next step is to complete an NCRS online registration. Go to <u>https://www.ncrs.org/</u> | NCRS | National Corvette Restorers Society. and select " Services " - Coming Events - Event Registration - then scroll down to Texas Chapter Meet 5-18-19. Log in and complete the NCRS registration form.

Total Corvette registration for this event is (8) cars. The NCRS cars will be grouped together at a location under the TMS grandstands.

The Concours Judging Program is a new venue that allows Corvettes with modifications to participate in the NCRS judging activities. Many of these modified Corvettes are well presented but would not fare well under the traditional Flight Judging system; thus, owners now have an avenue for display and judging. Modified Corvettes will be judged in two categories - Stock Division and Modified Division. The Stock Division offers two awards (Blue Ribbon and Red Ribbon) while the Modified Division also offers two awards (427 Award and 327 Award). Full details on the registration process are not yet available, and I should have them for the next newsletter. Probably both NCRS and LSCC registration will be required.



2019 NCM National Parks Tour




The TXFallen Tribute Event began in 2008 as a police bike race honoring the lives of Texas officers killed in the line of duty. Over the years it has grown into a community fund raising event benefit-ting the Texas Police Chiefs Association Foundation. Through this their Officer Death Benefit Fund provides monetary assistance within 24 hours to the families of officers working in Texas who die in the line of duty. In 2018 they were able to provide each family with a check for \$5000 to help with immediate financial needs.

The bike race and event takes place each fall at the shops of Highland Village in Highland Village Texas. The 2019 dates for the event have not been finalized. There are many opportunities for you to get involved, such as, sponsorships, donations, and participation in the event itself. Since 2008 we have raised over \$210,000 for the Fallen Officer Fund. Help us reach our goal of \$50,000 this year!
