Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, it offers just about any activity an owner of "America's Sports Car" could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, DragRacing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

Road Trips – Want to explore the wide open road? The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. A large group recently returned from a caravan to Eureka Springs, Arkansas, winning the club participation event at the show. Past trips have taken us to the Upper Pennisula of Michigan, the Barrett Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the National Corvette Museum's 15th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

Day Trips – Want to enjoy North Texas? Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members' garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other's company.

Open Road Racing – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just click on <u>Open Road Racing</u>.

Drag Racing – Want to "go fast"? Join the club Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplexfor trophies and bragging rights. Many members –both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Drag Racing</u>".

Autocross – Want to sharpen your driving skills? Try autocross! An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just "click" on "Autocross".

NCRS – Want your older model corvette to be an accurate icon? Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just "click" on "NCRS".

Car Shows – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or an out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in Dallas Autorama.

Displays and Parades – Looking to share the Corvetter spirit? Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a large contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We've been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway's oval before races. Christmas finds us backing up the bikers in the Great Texas Toy Run that benefits thousands of needy children in the area. The Dallas Veterans' Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

Lone Star Corvette Classic – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the "Classic" attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US and Canada. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including judged and Show N Shine indoor car shows, a variety of automotive vendors, good food, and exciting track events held on the Texas Motor Speedway's oval and road course. 100% of the net proceeds from the Classic go to support the Club's two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children's Charities, and a third charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members.

Club Meetings – We want you! The Club meets on the second Saturday of each month at various locations around the Metroplex. We would love to have you come to a meeting and "check us out."

Oldest Surviving Production Corvette Classic Donated to NCM

During the Bash in late April the Museum's latest and possibly most significant acquisition was unveiled. Its story follows.

Of the three cars in those famous June 1953 photographs of the first Corvettes coming off the Flint, Michigan, assembly line, only one still exists. But it now exists as two separate cars. But one of the two cars is only half of a car. But it still carries enough unique history to warrant its recent donation to the National Corvette Museum, where it's since been installed as one of the museum's crown jewels.

"This is the oldest surviving production Corvette chassis," said Derek Moore, the curator for the museum. "It's a huge, huge donation for us. It's one of the most significant cars in the museum now."

The first two Corvettes off the assembly line didn't last long; Chevrolet destroyed each in the process of testing them. The third one, E53F001003, which carried the internal designation of ES-127, nearly suffered the same fate. According to Chevrolet's records, Chevrolet sent it off to GM's Harrison Radiator division up in Lockport, New York, for cold weather testing to see if its fiberglass body would hold up to jarring use in sub-freezing temperatures. As John Amgwert wrote in Corvette Restorer, the so-called "shake test" involved 14 hours of a dynamometer driving the wheels, each with a weight placed out of phase, all at negative 20-degrees Fahrenheit.

Once #003 passed those tests, Harrison then sent it to the GM Proving Grounds in Milford, Michigan, where it underwent 5,000 miles of testing on the Belgian block road. While the Belgian blocks didn't do the car in, the engineers who scrutinized #003 afterward found some chassis fatigue and so in August 1953 separated the body and chassis to study each further. According to Randy Leffingwell's *Legendary Corvettes: 'Vettes Made Famous on Track and Screen*, the engineers' inspections led to a number of improvements incorporated into the 1954 Corvette's chassis.

From then on, according to Moore, the stories of each half diverge. Chevrolet ended up mounting the body of #003 onto a 1955 Corvette chassis and selling it to the public. Not until the 1970s did it reemerge in the possession of Fresno-based early Corvette collector Ed Thiebaud. That car has since gone through a full restoration before selling at Barrett-Jackson's 2006 Scottsdale auction for \$1.1 million.

The chassis of #003 similarly sold to the public with either a late 1954 or 1955 Corvette body atop it. While urban legends seem to abound regarding the early years of chassis #003, it didn't resurface until the early 1980s, after Phil Havens went to restore his 1955 Corvette only to find that the body and chassis didn't quite match up. Even after discovering the chassis number and its historic value thanks to Corvette historian Sam Folz, Havens reportedly only wanted to restore his '55 and, if it worked out for everybody, to reunite chassis #003 with body #003.

It never did work out, however, so Havens held onto chassis #003 until several years ago, when he sold the chassis to Ed Foss of Roanoke, Indiana. Foss, in turn, decided that the world didn't need yet another Polo White six-cylinder 1953 Corvette #003, especially one without its original engine or body, but he also wanted to highlight the chassis number that made the car unique. So, after seeing the various

build it as another cutaway.

For this one, Mackay sourced a 1954 body and sliced it lengthwise down the middle of the body. The idea being, according to Moore, "to leave the driver's side open to see the serial number" stamped on the left frame rail just behind the driver's seat. At the same time, it was to remain drivable, so Mackay installed a full Blue Flame six-cylinder drivetrain, driver's seat, and floating headlamp and taillamp.

The cutaway #003 debuted in March 2017 at Amelia Island, and Moore said he had it on his wish list for the museum since before he became curator there. That wish came true in April when Foss donated the car to the museum and the museum, in turn, debuted the car as the centerpiece of its new Gateway exhibit dedicated to the foundations of the Corvette.

Also included in the new exhibit are a 1947 MG TC as part of a section dedicated to the postwar sports car craze in America, the 1946 Stout Y46 as part of a section dedicated to early experiments in fiberglass-bodied cars, and a 1951 Crosley to illustrate prior American sports cars, along with a Corvette clay modeling buck and a model of the Firebird I concept car.

"The cutaway is now the very first car that you see in the museum and sets the tone for the whole museum experience," Moore said.

As for that wish list of Moore's, now that the museum has the cutaway, he said he's not exactly sure what's atop the list. "I definitely would like to see one of the three Scaglietti Corvettes live here at the museum," he said.

The next event for the DFW area, and also for Texas, will be the Lone Star Regional in Frisco. This event will be held at the Embassy Suites Complex in Frisco, October 24 - 26, 2019.

The Concours Judging Program is a new venue that allows Corvettes with modifications to participate in the NCRS judging activities. Many of these modified Corvettes are well presented but would not fare well under the traditional Flight Judging system; thus, owners now have an avenue for display and judging. Modified Corvettes will be judged in two categories - Stock Division and Modified Division. The Stock Division offers two awards (Blue Ribbon and Red Ribbon) while the Modified Division also offers two awards (427 Award and 327 Award). Full details on the registration process are not yet available, and I should have them for the next newsletter. Probably both NCRS and LSCC registration will be required.

Autocross is held at Brookhaven College and the next one will be July 20th. We use a parking lot at the college so speeds are obviously slower than other forms of racing, but the activity level per minute can be higher than even Formula One due to the large number of elements which are packed into each course. The requested donation is **\$15 per car**. Helmets are required and loaners are always available.

Drag Racing is on summer break for now. The Fall racing season will start up again in September. The tracks are only 1/8 or 1/4 mile long, about the same distance as when you merge onto a freeway. Annual point standings are partially based on participation, so everybody that comes out to participate helps. Don't worry if you've never done it before, there will be plenty of folks willing to help. Contact Martha Kaus if you have any questions.

Open Road Racers, the next race will be the Sandhills Open Road Challenge, which is a 55-mile rally style open road race through the scenic Nebraska Sandhills on August 7th – 10th. Contact Mike Black at OpenRoadRacing@LoneStarCorvetteClub.com for further information. This is not the only open road race that the group goes to during the year. Please check the web site for other events and times.

Rally, the club does not sponsor rallies at this time but I will let you know about the SCCA group that holds rallies. Their next rally will be the "DFW Map Rally" on Saturday, Aug. 24th. They offer the popular GTA (Games, Tours, Adventures) rally, often known as the "gimmick rally". Speed is not a factor in these events. The teams are given a set of route instructions which tell them where to go so that all teams follow the same path to the ending point of the rally. For High Performance Driving Education (often known as "Tracking your car"), please contact Mike Krieger. This is **NOT RACING**, this is legally driving at speed in a very controlled environment. 

2019 NCM National Parks Tour



Oh ya, and there's a wonderful Corvette show to attend as well...located in a quaint shopping center.

Who knows we may win the Club participation award again but that'll take loads of y'all to sign up for this great trip as the Tulsa Corvette clubs typically come out in droves. Here is what I need you to do as a LSCC member. Go the LSCC web page and sign-in as a member, then go to the LSCC calendar and register there for this October event. 2020 Officer Elections this September

Bylaw changes passed this year will mean the 2020 Officer Elections will be held during September's LSCC business meeting. Nominations will be accepted starting in July and continuing into August. The change was to allow the newly-elected Officers more time to learn their job through mentoring with the outgoing Officers. A listing of the Officer positions can be found here. All Officer positions are up for election.

The amendments considered were:

Article VIII-Board of Directors, Section B.2, specifying when Officer elections are to be held. The LSCC BOD believes electing Officers earlier in the year, and allowing the newly-elected Officers more time to learn their job and mentor with the outgoing Officer before taking Office, will encourage more Member participation in the Club leadership.

PASSED

The proposed amendment to Section B.2 is: "Officers will be nominated in **July** and **August**, voted on in **September**, and installed into office in January (except the Classic Officer-elect), and will serve for one calendar year. Any office that is not decided by majority vote in a secret ballot will be decided by a majority vote of the voting membership that is present at the September business meeting."

<u>Article VIII, Section D.</u> would be amended to read "Nominations for officers will be made from the floor by the membership at the **July** and **August** business meetings, or in writing to an officer prior to the **August** business meeting."

What special skills are needed to fulfill your duties?

The Financial Officer must:

- 1. Be detail oriented,
- 2. Be skilled in QuickBooks,
- 3. Have dependable WiFi,
- 4. Have the ability to navigate multiple web pages that support the financial scope of the club,
- 5. Have up-to-date Word, Excel, and a dependable printer,
- 6. Have good organizational skills and
- 7. Understand basic bookkeeping.

Most importantly – must be detail oriented and an effective communicator.

How much time does it take each month for you to do club business?

For routine bookkeeping – an average 20-25 hours per month. In January, add an extra 10-15 hours for end-of-year reports, tax reports and budget preparation.

The Financial Officer attends monthly board meetings which meet at 9:30 a.m. prior to each monthly membership meeting. If unable to attend, the Financial Officer must provide another officer with the current balances of the Club and Classic accounts prior to the Board Meeting.

What advice would you give someone considering running for the board?

Be prepared to work as a team member. Get involved in the various activities of the club to become better acquainted with as many members as possible. Make yourself available as a volunteer in club activities, i.e., the annual LSCC Classic. Tell others how well the Board works together as a unit. Everyone has a vital role in the operation of this organization.

REMEMBER: You do not have to be on the board to attend a board meeting. It is always open the club members to observe and provide feedback.





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
