The Lone Star Corvette Club is dedicated to the Corvette lifestyle and the people that own them.

Our Club slogan says it all:

Good Friends... Great Cars!

Founded in 1982, the Club now has over 1,000 members – each with his/her own story to tell of how they found that perfect "Vette." Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, it offers just about any activity an owner of "America's Sports Car" could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, DragRacing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

Road Trips – Want to explore the wide open road? The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. A large group recently returned from a caravan to Eureka Springs, Arkansas, winning the club participation event at the show. Past trips have taken us to the Upper Pennisula of Michigan, the Barrett Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the National Corvette Museum's 15th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

Day Trips – Want to enjoy North Texas? Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members' garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other's company.

Open Road Racing – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just "click" on "Open Road Racing".

Drag Racing – Want to "go fast"? Join the club Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplexfor trophies and bragging rights. Many members –both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Drag Racing</u>".

Autocross – Want to sharpen your driving skills? Try autocross! An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just "click" on "Autocross".

NCRS – Want your older model corvette to be an accurate icon? Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just "click" on "NCRS".

Car Shows – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or an out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in Dallas Autorama.

Displays and Parades – Looking to share the Corvetter spirit? Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a large contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We've been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway's oval before races. Christmas finds us backing up the bikers in the Great Texas Toy Run that benefits thousands of needy children in the area. The Dallas Veterans' Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

Lone Star Corvette Classic – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the "Classic" attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US and Canada. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including judged and Show N Shine indoor car shows, a variety of automotive vendors, good food, and exciting track events held on the Texas Motor Speedway's oval and road course. 100% of the net proceeds from the Classic go to support the Club's two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children's Charities, and a third charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members.

Club Meetings – We want you! The Club meets on the second Saturday of each month at various locations around the Metroplex. We would love to have you come to a meeting and "check us out."

The Concours Judging Program is a new venue that allows Corvettes with modifications to participate in the NCRS judging activities. Many of these modified Corvettes are well presented but would not fare well under the traditional Flight Judging system; thus, owners now have an avenue for display and judging. Modified Corvettes will be judged in two categories - Stock Division and Modified Division. The Stock Division offers two awards (Blue Ribbon and Red Ribbon) while the Modified Division also offers two awards (427 Award and 327 Award). Full details on the registration process are not yet available, and I should have them for the next newsletter. Probably both NCRS and LSCC registration will be required.

Open Road Racing Open road racing stars on Jan. 2nd with registration for the Big Bend Open Road Race. The dates for the race are April 22-25 so mark your calendar. Talk to Mike Black, open road racing coordinator (and past winner of this event) if you have any questions. He will stress to you the importance of registering early (1 minute after opening) as there are only a limited number of competitors.

The BBORR takes place on US Highway 285 South from Fort Stockton to Sanderson and back (about 59.0 miles each way - or 118.0 miles). The road is closed by the police for the race, so sit back, buckle up and get ready for the ride of a lifetime. There are different classes of racers depending on the speed you want to average over this distance. Speed classes start at a boring 85MPH and go all the way to unlimited. This event alone brings in hundreds of people to these small West Texas communities from all over the U.S. and Europe.

This year's Big Bend Open Road Race will have something for everyone, so make plans now to be a part of this exciting event in West Texas. The event starts off in Sanderson on Wednesday and Thursday includes activities for the racers including registration, technical inspection, rookie school, practice runs, and qualifying. A Welcome Party will also be held on Thursday at 5 p.m.

On Friday, the activities move to Fort Stockton for additional racer functions and a Car Show from 4:00 p.m. – 5:30 p.m. in Rooney Park. Everyone is invited to come and meet the drivers and see their cars.

On Saturday, the Annual After Race Party in the Park will be held in Rooney Park from 12:30 – 5:30 p.m. The racers will end up here after they cross the finish line. There will be music, food, and drinks and lots and lots of FUN!!! Everyone is invited to come out and see the cars, take pictures, get autographs, etc. **Don't miss out on this racing event.** www.bborr.com

High Performance Driving Education These events continue through the winter season but as always you have to register well in advance. The morning starts out with a driver's meeting. Drivers are already pre-assigned into one of three or four different levels of run groups (pending event) with in-car instructors assigned accordingly. Each run group has instructional classes in-between their 4 to 5 ontrack run sessions over the course of the day. Each time a Beginner or Novice driver goes on the track they will have an assigned instructor seated beside them for live feedback, guidance, instruction and evaluation at the end of the course to be able to further guide us in improving your performance driving needs. This is a great way to learn about your car and what it and you can do!

All other competitive events are done for the season and will start again in the spring.

David Orrick says thank-you so much for allowing him to serve on the LSCC Board as the Competitive Events Officer for the past two years. He had a great time and knows that Competitive Events is in great hands.



Next year will be the 49th year for the Black Hills Corvette Classic. The Sioux Falls Corvette Club typically expects about 400 Corvettes to attend. Assuming that next year's event is similar to this year's, there will be plenty to see and do at this all Corvette extravaganza including: a banquet, drag racing, autocross, a show and shine, multiple sight-seeing drives including "Breakfast with the Presidents", opportunities to ride the "1880 Train" and more.

Annual Dues Increase Proposal

We are facing a very important challenge – how to meet the rising costs of doing business as a club after sustaining a 72% reduction in our sponsor financial support. As most of you are aware, this June Classic Chevrolet, our primary sponsor, opted to no longer serve as our club sponsor. Fortunately, The Thompson Group, affiliated with Classic Chevrolet, stepped up and agreed to continue their portion of the sponsorship, but at greatly reduced level. Prior to June we enjoyed financial support from Classic Chevrolet/The Thompson Group at \$21,500.00 annually. The Thompson Group committed to financial support of \$6,000.00 annually, so we are faced with how to handle the loss of \$15,500.00 while still continuing to provide the current level of activities and services to our members.

The Club's largest financial requirements are the Classic event, Membership and the Christmas Party. Classic: 25% of the total club sponsorship is dedicated to the Classic. That support has been reduced from \$5,375.00 to \$1,500.00, a drop of \$3,875.00. This reduction has resulted in the Classic, Inc. board considering ways to lower the costs of the 2020 event without severely limiting activities. The Classic draws participants from all over the country and is the sole fund raiser for our support to the National Corvette Museum, Speedway Children's Charities and a Rotating Charity that is selected each March. We need to continue putting on a high-quality Classic event that will keep drawing Corvette participants or run the risk of becoming irrelevant. In 2001, the club made the decision to allocate \$15.00 from member dues as additional support the Classic, the offset being members would be able to enter their car in Member Show N' Shine at no charge, a \$45.00 savings. Membership: Expenses have increased due to higher postage and printing costs associated with new member packets, name badges, service pins and the annual Member Directory. Christmas Party: Several years ago, the board made the decision to subsidize the annual year end party, electing to cover over 50% of the actual meal expenses in an effort to make the event accessible so members could celebrate the holiday.

The possibility of a dues increase was discussed at the November and December board meetings and after much discussion and review of information from 20 other Corvette clubs across the country, the board approved a proposal to increase the annual club dues from \$50.00 to \$70.00 effective February 1, 2020. LSCC is the largest Corvette club and other club's dues ranged from a high of \$150.00 to a low of \$80.00. No other club offered the type of activities and benefits to club members as LSCC. The last dues increase was in June of 2001.

To recap the rational for a dues increase:

	\$15,500.00 loss of club sponsor financial support
	Increasing costs of postage and printing
	Increasing subsidy of the Annual Christmas Party
	\$3,875.00 reduction in financial support to Classic, Inc.
	Potential reduction in charity support without an increas

Any increase to the annual member dues will require amendments to **Article V - Dues** of the Bylaws and **Section C - Assessment of Dues, Sections 1 & 2** as outlined in **Appendix B - Lone Star Corvette Club Financial Policy**. An increase in club dues will also impact Lifetime Memberships and will require an amendment to **Article IV - Membership, Section C, Sub-section 1** of the Bylaws.

Those amendments are outlined in the following pages of this Newsletter.

The Board of Directors recommends approval of an increase to the Annual Member Dues to \$70.00, taking effect February 1, 2020 and to Amendments to the Bylaws and Financial Policy as outlined.

This is an extremely important issue, so please plan on attending the January 11 club meeting at Corvette World where these issues will be voted on. We want all our members to participate in this decision.

CHEVROLET TO ENTER 2020 IMSA RACING SEASON WITH MID-ENGINE C8.R

DETROIT- Chevrolet begins a new chapter in its storied racing legacy with the introduction of the new midengine Corvette race car, known as the C8.R. The C8.R will be Chevrolet's first midengine race car to compete in IMSA's GTLM class and the first clean sheet race car design since the C5.R debuted in 1999. It will make its racing debut at Rolex 24 at Daytona on Jan. 25, 2020.

The C8.R is based on the strong foundation of the 2020 Corvette Stingray. There is a deeper level of technology transfer between the race car and production Corvette than ever before, which helps contribute to many of its advancements. As a result, the C8.R shares the highest percentage of parts between the production and race car than any previous generation.

"It was important for us to develop the new race car alongside the production car, so that each product could properly take advantage of the new architecture," said Ed Piatek, Corvette chief engineer. "The benefits of this mid-engine supercar, including its incredible balance and connected-to-the-road feel, will be obvious on the street and the track."

Engineered for the Racing Environment

Since certain features of the 2020 Corvette Stingray aren't necessary in a racing environment, the engineering and design teams found innovative ways to get benefits out of every part of the vehicle. For example, on the C8.R, a single centrally-mounted radiator was placed in the area used as the front storage compartment on the production Corvette. Ultra-bright racing headlights were packaged on the race car where the radiators are located on the production car.

In compliance with IMSA engine displacement rules, the C8.R will feature a 5.5L naturally-aspirated V8 engine, producing 500 hp and 480 ft.-lb. of torque.

A new compact Xtrac six-speed sequential gearbox was developed in order to provide room at the rear of the C8.R to package a race car specific diffuser.

"We have looked forward to racing a production-based mid-engine Corvette for a long time," said Jim Campbell, Chevrolet U.S. vice president of Performance and Motorsports. "The debut of the C8.R is the result of immense collaboration between GM Engineering, Propulsion, Design and the Corvette Racing team. As Corvette Racing enters its third decade of competition, we're excited to begin the next chapter."

Designed to Improve Aero, Weight and Stiffness

Improving aerodynamics, increasing stiffness and decreasing weight from the previous generation car were all primary focuses of the C8.R development.

The use of computer analytics made it possible to start the design of the race car well in advance of any production Corvette components being available. Chevrolet's state of the art Driver in the Loop Simulator was heavily utilized to evaluate numerous chassis and aero design concepts. The engineering and design teams produced thousands of 3D-printed rapid prototype parts for chassis and wind tunnel testing. The use of these development tools resulted in a race car with improved aerodynamics, vehicle dynamics and weight distribution.

The C8.R utilizes a production 2020 Stingray chassis structure produced in the Bowling Green Assembly plant. The chassis is then modified to meet race series requirements. The new C8.R chassis structure is significantly stiffer and lighter than its predecessor.

With a lower center of gravity and more even weight distribution on the wheels, Corvette Racing worked closely with Michelin to optimize the tire compound and construction to best support the unique traction needs of a mid-engine race car. The C8.R will ride on 18 inch MICHELIN® Pilot® Sport GT competition tires.

Sporting Both Yellow and Silver

While yellow continues to be a mainstay of Corvette Racing, it is now joined by a new look for the 2020 season.

The No. 4 race car features a new silver livery, inspired by the color of iconic Corvette concepts such as the 1973 Chevrolet Aerovette and the 1959 Corvette Stingray Racer that pushed the envelope both in design and on-track performance. This car also features yellow accents.

It will be joined by the No. 3 race car in a yellow color scheme with silver accents that continues the lineage of the successful GTLM racing Corvettes.

"Since the mid-engine race car is such a revolutionary vehicle, we felt it would be fitting to honor Corvette Racing's legacy with both a redesigned, modern livery along with a traditional livery in Corvette yellow," said Vlad Kapitonov, lead creative designer, Chevrolet Performance Cars. "Both liveries pay homage to Corvette's Racing storied heritage, as well as the impressive engineering and design milestones that led to up to this extraordinary race car."

Debut Race at Rolex 24 at Daytona

Corvette Racing partners for the 2020 season includes Mobil 1, Michelin and SiriusXM.

The C8.R will make its 2020 debut at Rolex 24 at Daytona on January 25th and 26th having already stretched its legs at Road Atlanta Michelin Raceway by performing a ceremonial lap on the track prior to the 22nd annual Petit LeMans.

For the first time in nearly a decade, Corvette Racing will feature a new full-season driver roster for the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship. As the program prepares for its initial campaign with the new Chevrolet Corvette C8.R, Jordan Taylor will join Corvette Racing on a full-time basis starting with the Rolex 24 At Daytona in the GT Le Mans (GTLM) category.

Taylor will join Antonio Garcia in the No. 3 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Corvette C8.R – featuring a yellow livery with silver accents. In the No. 4 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Corvette – silver with yellow accents – Oliver Gavin and Tommy Milner reunite for the ninth consecutive season, making them the longest-running driver pairing currently in IMSA.

The quartet will contest the entire GTLM season with the Corvette C8.R. Their combined record in IMSA competition is unmatched with a combined 102 victories and 13 championships:

- García 17 wins / three championships
- Gavin 48 wins / five championships
- Milner 16 wins / two championships
- Taylor 21 wins / two championships

"We couldn't be more excited to have this group of talented drivers behind the wheel of the mid-engine Corvette C8.R for the 2020 IMSA season," said Jim Campbell, Chevrolet U.S. vice president, Performance and Motorsports. "Given our rich history at Daytona International Speedway, we are proud to debut the C8.R at the Rolex 24 At Daytona."

Taylor has previous experience as a driver for Corvette Racing, having been part of the team's endurance lineup from 2012-2017. In that span, he was part of a Corvette Racing victory at the 24 Hours of Le Mans in 2015 and finished second at Sebring and Petit Le Mans in 2012. Taylor, a two-time IMSA Driver's Champion, will partner with Garcia. The two were endurance teammates in 2012-14 and again in 2017.

This will be Garcia's ninth full season with Corvette Racing, having partnered with Jan Magnussen for the previous eight. Garcia has 16 wins with Corvette, including three at the 24 Hours of Le Mans. Garcia is also a three-time GTLM Driver's Champion.

Gavin and Milner continue a partnership that is the standard-bearer for Corvette Racing and modern-day IMSA. They've won 14 races and two IMSA titles together, the most recent in 2016.

Gavin will compete for the 19th consecutive season with Corvette Racing and is the longest-serving and most successful driver in team history. He has 50 victories with the program including five at Le Mans; his most recent was 2015 with Milner and Taylor. Milner joined the team in 2011 and won Le Mans for the first time the same season. He was teamed with Gavin the following year, and they went on to win the American Le Mans Series' GT Championship.

ANTONIO GARCIA, NO. 3 MOBIL 1/SiriusXM CHEVROLET CORVETTE C8.R: "First off, thanks to Jan for all the great years we had in Corvette Racing. I'm proud of what we all were able to accomplish together as a team.

"Now as I look ahead, welcome back to Jordan. I am happy to have him now as a full-time teammate. We obviously know each other very well, so I'm looking forward sharing the car together and hopefully returning to our usual Corvette Racing form. The 2020 season is an important one for all of Corvette Racing with the new C8.R. It's very different from any Corvette I have ever driven but in a positive way. I'm anxious to continue testing and development with all our team."

JORDAN TAYLOR, NO. 3 MOBIL 1/SiriusXM CHEVROLET CORVETTE C8.R: "It's a huge honor to be back with Corvette Racing for 2020 and part of the full-season lineup. I'm very proud to be joining one of the most successful teams in sports car racing history and to represent the Corvette and Chevrolet brands. I was very fortunate to spend six years with Corvette in the endurance races driving both the C6.R and C7.R. Now being back with the brand new C8.R is really special. I am especially happy to be back driving alongside Antonio, who I believe is one of the best GT drivers in the world. I know I will have a lot to learn over the next few months leading to Daytona, but I'm ready and looking forward to the challenge of GTLM."

OLIVER GAVIN, NO. 4 MOBIL 1/SiriusXM CHEVROLET CORVETTE C8.R: "It's another honor to represent Chevrolet and Corvette Racing again in the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship. If you had told me back in 2002 when I first joined the program that I would continue for 19 years, I'd never believe it. I'm appreciative of the confidence that everyone at Corvette Racing has in me, and I'm absolutely delighted to be back with Tommy now in the Corvette C8.R. It's a wonderful car to drive and is a huge step forward for Corvette Racing. Tommy and I have been together for many races and many seasons. Certainly last year was full of misfortune and things not going our way. The great thing about Corvette Racing is that we always try to take that next step above our competitors, and I think we have an excellent chance

to do that with the C8.R."

TOMMY MILNER, NO. 4 MOBIL 1/SiriusXM CHEVROLET CORVETTE C8.R: "I can't wait to start this next chapter of Corvette Racing with the entire team, which has worked so hard on the new 2020 Corvette C8.R race car. This will be the biggest adjustment the program has ever had to make with an all-new car. But with the time, effort and testing spent so far, I'm confident we will be ready to take on all challenges. I'm really looking forward to be continuing with Oliver again in the No. 4 car, and I think we're both eager to get back to winning races and championships with this new Corvette."

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
