Just bought a new Corvette? Or just love them? Welcome, you've come to the right place!

The Lone Star Corvette Club is dedicated to the Corvette lifestyle and the people that own them.

Our Club slogan says it all:

Good Friends... Great Cars!

Founded in 1982, the Club now has over 1,000 members – each with his/her own story to tell of how they found that perfect "Vette." Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, it offers just about any activity an owner of "America's Sports Car" could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, DragRacing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

Road Trips – Want to explore the wide open road? The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. A large group recently returned from a caravan to Eureka Springs, Arkansas, winning the club participation event at the show. Past trips have taken us to the Upper Pennisula of Michigan, the Barrett Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the National Corvette Museum's 15th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

Day Trips – Want to enjoy North Texas? Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members' garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other's company.

Open Road Racing – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just"click" on "Open Road Racing".

Drag Racing – Want to "go fast"? Join the club Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplexfor trophies and bragging rights. Many members –both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Drag Racing</u>".

Autocross – Want to sharpen your driving skills? Try autocross! An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just "click" on "Autocross".

NCRS – Want your older model corvette to be an accurate icon? Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just "click" on "NCRS".

Car Shows – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or an out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in Dallas Autorama.

Displays and Parades – Looking to share the Corvetter spirit? Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a large contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We've been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway's oval before races. Christmas finds us backing up the bikers in the Great Texas Toy Run that benefits thousands of needy children in the area. The Dallas Veterans' Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

Lone Star Corvette Classic – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the "Classic" attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US and Canada. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including judged and Show N Shine indoor car shows, a variety of automotive vendors, good food, and exciting track events held on the Texas Motor Speedway's oval and road course. 100% of the net proceeds from the Classic go to support the Club's two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children's Charities, and a third charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members.

Club Meetings – We want you! The Club meets on the second Saturday of each month at various locations around the Metroplex. We would love to have you come to a meeting and "check us out."

I'd like to encourage you to further explore our website. A glimpse at the Club's Event Calendar will give you a good overview of just how active and diverse our Club is. Just "click" on "Event Calendar".

Hopefully, as you read this, the National Corvette Museum, closed due to Covid-19 restrictions, will have re-opened. With that opening several new or renovated exhibits will be on view for the first time. The most amazing of these is the E. Pierce Marshall Performance Gallery. It is named by major sponsor, LSCC Member Pierce Marshall Jr. in honor of his father.

"We kicked off renovations last November and have been hard at work on the new E. Pierce Marshall Memorial Performance Gallery ever since," shared Museum Director of Collections / Curator Derek E. Moore. "For those who have visited us in the past, we think they'll be impressed with the upgrades we've been able to make to the space. And for those who have yet to visit, they'll be equally impressed by technology as advanced as the car it celebrates."

"We wanted not only a clean look, but also a space that would lend itself to showcasing historic racing videos and stories about each car on display. The concept is to have projection with each car, as well as digital labels that allow visitors to learn more through an interactive experience," said Moore. "Rather than remove or paint over the existing racing mural, we will install a secondary wall that keeps it protected and intact behind the scenes."

"Having known there was a time that there was a prospect that the (Corvette) program was going to shut down – it's almost unfathomable that we are now to the C8. We are to Zora's dream of having a mid-engine and I'm ecstatic. I hope it will do what GM has been hoping for a long time and that is to bring in younger customers. I think's it's really cool we are doing this renovation to the Museum to have something more interactive, to have something the younger people will appreciate and be able to learn how unique Corvette is, and frankly sports car history."

LSCC Trip to NCM Rescheduled

Knocked down twice by Covid-19 restrictions, our club trip to the Museum is not out. First set for the Bash in April, then moved to May, our new departure date is September 1st.

With the Bash converted to a virtual event, recognition of LSCC members for their sponsorship of the XP-987GT two rotor Corvette will be held at the 26th Anniversary, September 2-5. Other scheduled or possible activities include:

The Concours Judging Program is a new venue that allows Corvettes with modifications to participate in the NCRS judging activities. Many of these modified Corvettes are well presented but would not fare well under the traditional Flight Judging system; thus, owners now have an avenue for display and judging. Modified Corvettes will be judged in two categories - Stock Division and Modified Division. The Stock Division offers two awards (Blue Ribbon and Red Ribbon) while the Modified Division also offers two awards (427 Award and 327 Award). Full details on the registration process are not yet available, and I should have them for the next newsletter. Probably both NCRS and LSCC registration will be required.

LSCC Officer Duties

- The duties of the **President** will include, but not be limited to:
- 1. Preside over business and Board of Director meetings and serve as Chairman of the Board of Directors.
- 2. Appoint committees, as necessary, to meet the needs of the club.
- 3. Maintain and develop relationships with Club Sponsor, General Motors, National Corvette Museum, and other clubs.
- 4. Provide planning strategies that support LSCC's welfare and future success.
- The duties of the **Vice Presiden**t will include, but not be limited to:
- 1. Preside at the Board of Director and business meeting in the absence of the President.
- 2. Arrange and schedule monthly business and Board of Directors meetings.
- 3. Assist the President, when required.
- 4. Coordinate charitable activities.
- 5. Maintain, update, and coordinate Board of Director job descriptions.
- 6. Maintain storage of LSCC documents and records.
- The duties of the **Competitive Events Officer** will include, but not be limited to:
- 1. Coordinate racing activities drag racing, auto cross, rallies and High Performance Driving Education (HPDE) events.
- 2. Coordinate car shows in town and out of town that involve certification judging by sanctioning organizations like NCRS. In the event the nature of the event is ambiguous, the Club President shall make the decision whether responsibility of the event is Recreational or Competitive.
- 3. Coordinate participation in NCRTS activities.
- 4. Assure that Club insurance requirements are met for each event.
- The duties of the **Recreational Events Officer** will include, but not be limited to:
- 1. Coordinate road trips, including trips to car shows with a primary emphasis of fund raising and/or recreation. In the event the nature of the event is ambiguous, the Club President shall make the decision whether responsibility of the event is Recreational of Competitive.
- 2. Coordinate car displays.
- 3. Coordinate dinner cruises.
- 4. Coordinate swap meets, detail days, shade tree events, etc.
- 5. Ensure that Club insurance requirements are met for Club sanctioned events that meet coverage criteria as outlined by the Club's insurance carrier. This

includes ensuring that event coordinators complete the required Independent Club Event Liability (ICEL) forms and collect the required, current, properly formatted, and signed waivers from event participants. The Recreational Events Officer will submit the completed ICEL to the insurance agent and ensure that all documents are delivered to the Recording Secretary for archival.

- The duties of the **Recording Secretary** will include, but not be limited to:
- 1. Keep the minutes of the business and Board of Directors meetings and will submit it to the Board of Directors and the business meeting minutes to the newsletter editor.
- 2. Maintain all written communications for the club.
- 3. In his/her absence, the recording secretary will choose a member in good standing of the club to represent them and fulfill the duties and obligations of the recording secretary.
- 4. Maintain the club Bylaws.
- The duties of the **Membership Officer** will include, but not be limited to:
- 1. Process and maintain all applications for membership.
- 2. Keep an updated membership list with all member information and will provide it to all officers as needed. This information will be used for club business only.
- 3. In his/her absence, the membership officer will choose a member in good standing of the club to represent them and fulfill the duties and obligations of the membership officer.
- 4. Responsible for the annual membership directory.
- The duties of the **Financial Officer** will include, but not be limited to:
- 1. Maintain an accurate accounting of all financial transactions.
- 2. Provide monthly financial statements.
- 3. Establish procedures for documenting and recording all transactions.
- 4. Reconcile club accounts.
- 5. Develop an annual budget.
- The duties of the **Treasurer** will include, but not be limited to:
- 1. Responsible for all payments and deposits of funds.
- 2. Keep said funds on deposit in a financial institution.
- 3. Supervise the purchasing and sale of merchandise.






