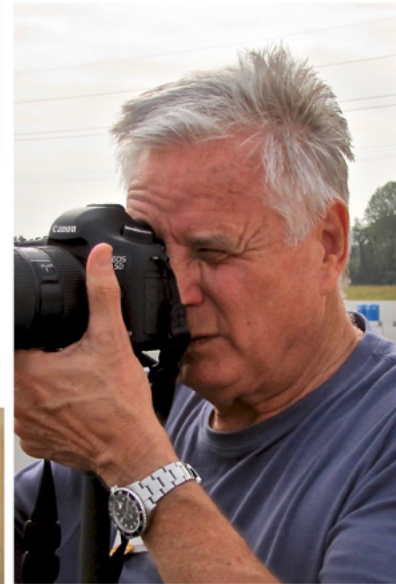

The Lone Star Corvette Club is dedicated to the Corvette lifestyle and the people that own them.

Our Club slogan says it all:

Founded in 1982, the Club now has over 1,000 members – each with his/her own story to tell of how they found that perfect “Vette.” Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, it offers just about any activity an owner of “America’s Sports Car” could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, Drag Racing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

Road Trips – Want to explore the wide open road? The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. A large group recently returned from a caravan to Eureka Springs, Arkansas, winning the club participation event at the show. Past trips have taken us to the Upper Peninsula of Michigan, the Barrett Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the National Corvette Museum’s 15th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

Day Trips – Want to enjoy North Texas? Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members’ garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other’s company.

Open Road Racing – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just “click” on [“Open Road Racing”](#).

Drag Racing – Want to “go fast”? Join the club Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplex for trophies and bragging rights. Many members – both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just “click” on [“Drag Racing”](#).

Autocross – Want to sharpen your driving skills? Try autocross! An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just “click” on [“Autocross”](#).

NCRS – Want your older model corvette to be an accurate icon? Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just “click” on [“NCRS”](#).

Car Shows – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or an out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in Dallas Autorama.

Displays and Parades – Looking to share the Corvetter spirit? Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a large contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We’ve been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway’s oval before races. Christmas finds us backing up the bikers in the Great Texas Toy Run that benefits thousands of needy children in the area. The Dallas Veterans’ Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

Lone Star Corvette Classic – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the “Classic” attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US and Canada. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including judged and Show N Shine indoor car shows, a variety of automotive vendors, good food, and exciting track events held on the Texas Motor Speedway’s oval and road course. 100% of the net proceeds from the Classic go to support the Club’s two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children’s Charities, and a third charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members.

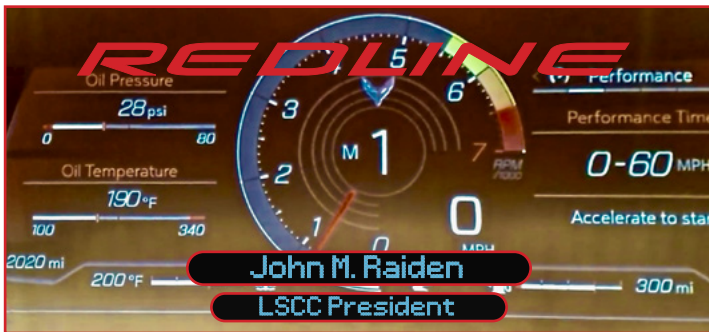

NCM News

If you are like me you are really tired of what Covid has done to our Corvette hobby. Yet another great annual trip, the Eureka Springs Corvette Weekend has been cancelled. But, more good news is coming from the Corvette Museum.

The Anniversary Celebration is on for September 2-5 and registration is open. This is shaping up as one of only two or three club trips remaining this year. We will caravan to the Corvette Museum for our twice postponed recognition of LSCC members as the naming rights sponsor of the XP-987 two rotor Corvette. NCM Insurance

With the trip to the Museum coming up and not much else happening in our Corvette community, it is a good time to mention insurance. I have provided this information in the past, but if you Corvette's insurance is not with NCM, this is certainly worth a read.

Last year one of our members mentioned a concern about their collector car insurance. As with most collector car policies, he had a mileage limit. I believe it was 3,000 miles. He was concerned because he is going on the NCM Caravan this August and might run over his limit. Fortunately, his policy is with NCM Insurance. He can raise his limit for this trip and lower it back to 3,000 next year. Mileage limits with NCM Insurance are available from 1,000 to 6,000 miles, and even unlimited.

Along this same line, another really great feature of NCM Insurance is rollover miles. An example of how this works is, let's say you have a 6,000 mile limit. You report your mileage at the beginning of the policy year, you only drive 5,000 miles, report your ending mileage and rollover 1,000 miles to the next year giving you 7,000.

Finally, probably the greatest feature of an NCM collector car policy is agreed value. An agreed value is established on the policy, and if there is a total loss you are paid that amount. If you have added dress-up accessories and/or wheels to your Corvette, at the very least you will have some difficulty collecting for those in the event of a loss on a "regular" policy. With agreed value add the cost of those items to the book value of the car up front. You will recover your investment, no questions asked, if a loss occurs.

In 2010, we switched three cars from regular auto insurance to the NCM Collector Car coverage. Not only did we acquire the benefits I've mentioned, we also saved \$2,100 per year. Get in touch with Adam Boca with NCM Insurance and get a quote. Reach him at Adam@corvettemuseum.org or 877/678-7626.

The Concours Judging Program is a new venue that allows Corvettes with modifications to participate in the NCRS judging activities. Many of these modified Corvettes are well presented but would not fare well under the traditional Flight Judging system; thus, owners now have an avenue for display and judging. Modified Corvettes will be judged in two categories - Stock Division and Modified Division. The Stock Division offers two awards (Blue Ribbon and Red Ribbon) while the Modified Division also offers two awards (427 Award and 327 Award). Full details on the registration process are not yet available, and I should have them for the next newsletter. Probably both NCRS and LSCC registration will be required.

LSCC Officer Duties

- The duties of the **President** will include, but not be limited to:

1. Preside over business and Board of Director meetings and serve as Chairman of the Board of Directors.
2. Appoint committees, as necessary, to meet the needs of the club.
3. Maintain and develop relationships with Club Sponsor, General Motors, National Corvette Museum, and other clubs.
4. Provide planning strategies that support LSCC's welfare and future success.

- The duties of the **Vice President** will include, but not be limited to:

1. Preside at the Board of Director and business meeting in the absence of the President.
2. Arrange and schedule monthly business and Board of Directors meetings.
3. Assist the President, when required.
4. Coordinate charitable activities.
5. Maintain, update, and coordinate Board of Director job descriptions.
6. Maintain storage of LSCC documents and records.

- The duties of the **Competitive Events Officer** will include, but not be limited to:

1. Coordinate racing activities – drag racing, auto cross, rallies and High Performance Driving Education (HPDE) events.
2. Coordinate car shows – in town and out of town – that involve certification judging by sanctioning organizations like NCRS. In the event the nature of the event is ambiguous, the Club President shall make the decision whether responsibility of the event is Recreational or Competitive.
3. Coordinate participation in NCRTS activities.
4. Assure that Club insurance requirements are met for each event.

- The duties of the **Recreational Events Officer** will include, but not be limited to:

1. Coordinate road trips, including trips to car shows with a primary emphasis of fund raising and/or recreation. In the event the nature of the event is ambiguous, the Club President shall make the decision whether responsibility of the event is Recreational or Competitive.
2. Coordinate car displays.
3. Coordinate dinner cruises.
4. Coordinate swap meets, detail days, shade tree events, etc.
5. Ensure that Club insurance requirements are met for Club sanctioned events that meet coverage criteria as outlined by the Club's insurance carrier. This

includes ensuring that event coordinators complete the required Independent Club Event Liability (ICEL) forms and collect the required, current, properly formatted, and signed waivers from event participants. The Recreational Events Officer will submit the completed ICEL to the insurance agent and ensure that all documents are delivered to the Recording Secretary for archival.

- The duties of the **Recording Secretary** will include, but not be limited to:

1. Keep the minutes of the business and Board of Directors meetings and will submit it to the Board of Directors and the business meeting minutes to the newsletter editor.
2. Maintain all written communications for the club.
3. In his/her absence, the recording secretary will choose a member in good standing of the club to represent them and fulfill the duties and obligations of the recording secretary.
4. Maintain the club Bylaws.

- The duties of the **Membership Officer** will include, but not be limited to:

1. Process and maintain all applications for membership.
2. Keep an updated membership list with all member information and will provide it to all officers as needed. This information will be used for club business only.
3. In his/her absence, the membership officer will choose a member in good standing of the club to represent them and fulfill the duties and obligations of the membership officer.
4. Responsible for the annual membership directory.

- The duties of the **Financial Officer** will include, but not be limited to:

1. Maintain an accurate accounting of all financial transactions.
2. Provide monthly financial statements.
3. Establish procedures for documenting and recording all transactions.
4. Reconcile club accounts.
5. Develop an annual budget.

- The duties of the **Treasurer** will include, but not be limited to:

1. Responsible for all payments and deposits of funds.
2. Keep said funds on deposit in a financial institution.
3. Supervise the purchasing and sale of merchandise.
4. Supervise all raffles.
5. Maintain physical asset inventory and control.

- The duties of the **Newsletter Editor** will include, but not be limited to:

1. Produce and distribute the club's monthly newsletter.

- The duties of the **Classic Officer** will include, but not be limited to:

1. Manage the Classic administration and logistical support.
2. Oversee the operation of the event itself.
3. Develop a Classic budget.

- The duties of the **Technical Officer** will include, but not be limited to:

Article VIII –Board of Directors

LSCC shall be governed by a Board of Directors comprised of the following:

Officers of the Club

Non-voting Appointed Members

Officers of the Club shall be:

President, Vice-President, Competitive Events, Financial, Recreational Events, Recording Secretary, Membership, Treasurer, Newsletter Editor, Classic and Technical Officer

Non-Voting Appointed members shall be:

National Corvette Museum Ambassador

Public Relations Manager

A. The Board of Directors may include, but is not required to include for governance purposes, a Non-Voting Representative of the LSCC Sponsor.

B. The term of office for Officers will be not more than two full, consecutive terms. Partial terms are not counted as part of a full term.

1. Each officer will be elected by a majority vote of the eligible voting members by secret ballot.

2. Officers will be nominated in July and August, voted on in September, and installed into office in January (except the Classic Officer-elect), and will serve for one calendar year. Any office that is not decided by majority vote in a secret ballot will be decided by a majority vote of the voting membership that is present at the September business meeting.

3. The Classic officer will take office upon the completion of the upcoming Lone Star Corvette Classic and will serve until the completion of the next Lone Star Corvette Classic.

C. To be nominated for a position on the Board of Directors, either elected or appointed, the candidate must be a full member for twelve months prior to the nomination month.

D. Nominations for Officers will be made from the floor by the membership at the July and August business meetings, or in writing to an Officer no later than seven calendar days after the August business meeting.

E. If the office of President becomes vacant for any reason during the calendar year, the Vice President will assume the office of President.

F. If any other officer position becomes vacant during their elected term, that vacancy will be filled by an election for the remaining term.

- 61st 1-2 team finish in program history

Corvette Racing went 1-2 at Sebring International Raceway as Oliver Gavin and Tommy Milner took a GT Le Mans (GTLM) victory in the Cadillac Grand Prix for the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship on Saturday.

The No. 4 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Chevrolet Corvette C8.R took a 0.480-second victory over the pole-sitting No. 3 Corvette of Jordan Taylor and Antonio Garcia – class winners two weeks ago at Daytona. It was the 12th victory for Corvette Racing at the 3.7-mile, 17-turn road course in central Florida, and the result moves Chevrolet into the GTLM Manufacturer's Championship lead after three races.

The team also won its 101st race in IMSA, 109th in program history and finished 1-2 for the 61st time. Gavin won for the seventh time at Sebring, and Milner took his third victory at the circuit.

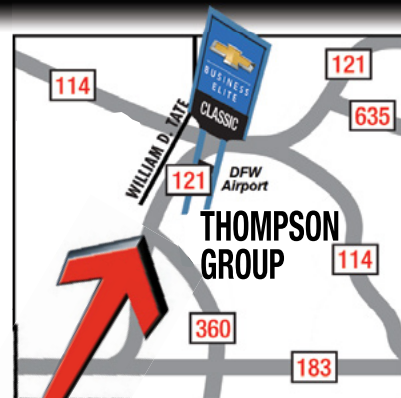
