# Just bought a new Corvette? Or just love them? Welcome, you've come to the right place!

The Lone Star Corvette Club is dedicated to the Corvette lifestyle and the people that own them.

Our Club slogan says it all:

### **Good Friends... Great Cars!**

Founded in 1982, the Club now has over 1,000 members – each with his/her own story to tell of how they found that perfect "Vette." Based in the Dallas – Fort Worth Metroplex, it offers just about any activity an owner of "America's Sports Car" could want: Road Trips, Day Trips, Open Road Racing, DragRacing, Autocross, NCRS (National Corvette Restorers Society), Car Shows, Displays and Parades, the Lone Star Corvette Classic, Club Meetings, and most of all, fun times with good friends.

**Road Trips** – Want to explore the wide open road? The Club takes at least one significant road trip each year, usually in conjunction with a Corvette event. A large group recently returned from a caravan to Eureka Springs, Arkansas, winning the club participation event at the show. Past trips have taken us to the Upper Pennisula of Michigan, the Barrett Jackson Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the National Corvette Museum's 15th Anniversary Caravan to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and many more.

**Day Trips** – Want to enjoy North Texas? Just about every month finds a group of us headed somewhere in our Corvettes for a day of fun on the road. It might be for a tour of some local wineries, a trip to the Historic Fort Worth Stockyards for a cattle drive and BBQ, a car show being held by another Corvette club, a tour of members' garages, or just a drive in the country to enjoy our cars and each other's company.

**Open Road Racing** – Like to go fast in your Vette? Many Club members participate in Open Road Racing at events held in Big Bend, Texas and Arnold, Nebraska. In addition, several driving schools are offered in the DFW area where you can go to hone your driving skills. For more information, just "click" on "Open Road Racing".

**Drag Racing** – Want to "go fast"? Join the club Drag Racers. They compete at tracks around the Metroplexfor trophies and bragging rights. Many members –both ladies and men – race cars (pickups too) in addition to Corvettes. No experience is required. For more information, just "click" on "<u>Drag Racing</u>".

**Autocross** – Want to sharpen your driving skills? Try autocross! An autocross is a timed competition where drivers navigate, one at a time, through a temporary course marked by traffic cones, usually in a parking lot. Autocross places more emphasis on car handling and driving skill than on sheer horsepower. For more information, just "click" on "Autocross".

**NCRS** – Want your older model corvette to be an accurate icon? Many Club members also belong to the NCRS – National Corvette Restorers Society. If you are into originality and the preservation of the Corvette as an icon, you will find many in the Club that share your passion. For more information, just "click" on "NCRS".

**Car Shows** – Love showing your Vette off or having it judged? On almost any weekend (except for a few in the winter), at least one group from the Club will be headed to either a local or an out-of-town car show. We usually caravan to the out-of-town shows as a group and use the trip as a good excuse to socialize and dine out together. The Club sponsors a group of members each year in Dallas Autorama.

**Displays and Parades** – Looking to share the Corvetter spirit? Every year we man a display of our cars in the Dallas New Car Show at the Convention Center. We also take a large contingent of Vettes to the State Fair of Texas. We've been asked in the past to drive Indy Car drivers around the Texas Motor Speedway's oval before races. Christmas finds us backing up the bikers in the Great Texas Toy Run that benefits thousands of needy children in the area. The Dallas Veterans' Day Parade has come to rely on the Club to provide cars and drivers for over 100 WWII Veterans each year. Ask any Club member who has participated and you will be told what an honor it is.

Lone Star Corvette Classic – In May of each year, the premier Corvette event in Texas is held at the Texas Motor Speedway by the Club. During its three day run, the "Classic" attracts hundreds of Corvettes and Corvette Club members from across the US and Canada. In addition, Corvette enthusiasts from around the area attend the event to take advantage of many different activities, including judged and Show N Shine indoor car shows, a variety of automotive vendors, good food, and exciting track events held on the Texas Motor Speedway's oval and road course. 100% of the net proceeds from the Classic go to support the Club's two main charities, The National Corvette Museum and Speedway Children's Charities, and a third charity chosen from several candidates each year by Club members.

**Club Meetings** – We want you! The Club meets on the second Saturday of each month at various locations around the Metroplex. We would love to have you come to a meeting and "check us out."

### **Build Sheets and Window Stickers**

Your Corvette collection just isn't complete without a copy of your build sheet and a reproduction window sticker! The National Corvette Museum offers build sheets and window stickers for any Corvette assembled in Bowling Green since the GM plant opened in 1981.


There is lots of nifty paperwork associated with cars. Most people throw the stuff out shortly after buying their car but in some cases the original paperwork is still available with the car.

The build sheet, often considered the "holy grail" to many folks, is a cool item to find. It is often the only means of verifying exactly what options came with your particular car, and helps you determine how many Corvettes were produced exactly like yours. The build sheet is what goes down the line with the car when it is being assembled. It indicates to the line worker exactly what goes on that specific car.

The window sticker is affixed to a new car when it is delivered to the consumer. A law was passed by Congress in 1958 requiring all automobile manufacturers to affix a price label to all new automobiles showing Manufacturers Suggested Retail Prices for a vehicle and all options installed at the factory. This law was proposed by Senator John Monroney and was to begin with new 1959 models.

The build sheet and window sticker can be reproduced on paper, slate, tempered glass or aluminum. To see all the options go to <u>corvettemuseum.org/learn/library-archives/build-sheets-window-stickers/</u>.



Pete Issokson, LSCC member, is starting a Cruise Night every Thursday at Corky's in Plano.


Corky's is located at 1900 Central on the East side between 15th and Park. Corky's holds 400 people and the parking lot has about 120 spots.

# Classic Road Rally #5

Sunday, November 15, 2020

The Classic Road Rally #5 will be on Sunday following our next Club Meeting and it will be a Poker Run. A 5-card had will be included with each car entry (\$25); you will be allowed to discard up to 3 cards from your hand and draw up to 3 new cards at \$1.00 per card. You will be allowed to buy additional 5 card poker hands (no limit, \$5 per hand, plus optional 3 discards per hand) at morning sign-in or at the finish check-in. Of course all extra poker hand money will be added to the Charity Tour donations. Winning card hands will be based on the following;

- 1. **Royal flush** A royal flush is an ace high straight flush. For example, A-K-Q-J-10 all of diamonds.
- 2. **Straight flush** A straight flush is a five-card straight, all in the same suit. For example, 7-6-5-4-3 all of spades.
- 3. **Four of a kind** Four of a kind, or quads, are four cards of equal value. For example, four jacks.
- 4. **Full house** A full house contains a set (3) of cards of one value and a pair of another value. For example, Q-Q-Q-2-2.
- 5. **Flush -** A flush is any 5 cards, all of the same suit. For example, K-Q-9-6-3 all of diamonds.
- 6. **Straight** Five cards of sequential value. Every possible straight will contain either a 5 or a 10. For example, 7-6-5-4-3 with different suits.
- 7. Three of a kind Three cards of the same value. For example, three aces.
- 8. **Two pairs -** This is two cards of one value and another two cards of another value. For example, two jacks and two 8s.
- 9. **One pair** One pair is two cards of the same rank. For example, two queens.

No rally gimmicks this time, other than drawing a poking hand(s) at the end. 

# A Corvette Story

I grew up in an era when you could count the major US car makers on three fingers and with your remaining ones count the brands/models they sold. As a natural-born "car nut," one of my favorite days each year was in September when the next model-year cars arrived in dealer showrooms. My dad, being a lifelong Chevy guy, would take me and my little brother downtown to the Chevrolet house to check out the new models. I was seven when the Corvette was introduced, but the first one I really remember was the '56 model; spectacular styling and a small block V8! From that day I dreamed about owning one. Every Corvette I saw turned my head (to this day). I can still return to the exact spot where I first laid eyes on a C3 (a yellow '68 on the campus of Texas A&M two weeks before I graduated).

My dream was finally (temporarily) realized in 1989 when I bought a numbers-matching '66 black convertible, 327 four-speed. That car gave me the most driving enjoyment I had ever experienced and considerable tinkering satisfaction, but I was compelled to sell it three years later. The dream then languished until 2009 when I bought a new C6 (black coupe, six-speed), which was my daily driver until I replaced it with a 2015 Stingray (black coupe, seven-speed). I thought the C6 was great and loved driving it, so I was astounded by how much better the C7 was.

Thankfully, my wife also loved the new one (yes, she can drive a manual). To celebrate our 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2017, she and I embarked on a road trip from our home in Murphy

bound for the Oregon coast and then Vancouver, BC. The second day out, somewhere in western Colorado, Karen was looking at the map and travel plan and asked me if I realized that our itinerary was exactly 50 days. (It was purely accidental.) During those seven weeks we drove 7,000 miles, minimizing four-lanes while traversing 13 states and visiting seven national parks/monuments and two Canadian Provincial parks. We

discovered on this trip that if we just scheduled a few hours at the laundromat every eight or nine days, we could travel this way *indefinitely*. It was the best road trip ever, a kid's dream realized touring the Great American West in America's sports car.

The 2015 had logged almost 60,000 miles by the time I learned for certain that the C8 would only be available with an automatic transmission. Thinking, "I may wear this one out before I'm ready to give up the stick," I replaced it with a new 2019 Stingray (you guessed it, black coupe, seven-speed). Like the 2015 before it, this one is my best car yet and I plan to drive the wheels off of it.

The "car nut" gene skipped a generation in my family. Although my sons like cars, neither of them would be considered a hard-core enthusiast. However, the gene bit with a vengeance on the next generation. My oldest grandson loved cars from the first time he

recognized what one was. At age three, he could distinguish between a Corvette and a Ferrari and tell you which was which. I began to cultivate the dream of a "car project" that we could do together when he was older, and over time I started chatting it up with him and his dad (my older son). Harboring a long-time lust for the Shelby Cobra (I know; please don't vote me out of the club just yet), I hoped he might be interested in building a reproduction kit together. To that end, in July 2019, then 13-year-old Jackson (a.k.a. J3) and I attended a "build school" sponsored by Factory Five Racing and Mott Community College in Howell, Michigan. Over three days, he and I and ten of our newest friends constructed one of FFR's "818" sports car kits (schedule conflicts precluded us from attending a Cobra class). We had a wonderful time together and a great hands-on learning experience, but during dinnertime conversations, he expressed a preference for buying something old that we could troubleshoot and fix up rather than building a kit "out of a box." This kicked off a whole new line of thinking.

Fast forward a few months and J3 and I are out to see the C8 during its road-show appearance at Classic Chevrolet. After the 20-minute queue and the 20-second sit in it, we decamped to a nearby Starbucks to continue our ruminations on "something old." Thoughts on the purpose of the project and candidate vehicles were kicked about and conclusions were memorialized on a napkin (at which point I felt compelled to give him a history lesson on the genesis of Southwest Airlines). One must-have that didn't make the napkin was manual transmission. The predominance of our favorite plastic car is apparent, even without my overtly influencing it.



This kicked off a flurry of on-line and in-person research and shopping with the aim of having a project car in possession by the time school was out this past spring. Discovering quickly that a chrome-bumper C3 would be out of our budget unless it was a complete basket case (which is beyond our capabilities and ambition), we expanded our target range to include up to 1977 models. In early May, I submitted the winning bid for a 1974 Stingray coupe in California being auctioned on eBay, violating every one of my own personal car-buying rules in the process. It's a low-option, four-speed, numbers-matching car, L82 modified with an Edelbrock intake manifold and carburetor.



We took delivery of "Ugly Betty" (my idea, not Jackson's) from the transporter and after a jump start managed to drive home without incident and begin her needs assessment. Averaging about one workday per week, we spent the first few weeks cleaning up the grime and grit accumulated from a life in Nevada and two years storage in California desert country, installing new

three-point seat belts, reconnecting the driver's side outside door release, replacing the shifter boots, adding a passenger-side outside mirror, returning the rally wheels to their original Argent silver, and installing new trim rings. The wheel paint and trim rings

improved the appearance so much, I've had to desist from using my original nickname (though we still have to do something about those bumper covers).

For having done very little pre-purchase due diligence, we got lucky. Professional inspection at DMS Corvette Shop in Garland determined it to be straight, free of serious rust, and apparently never crashed badly enough to require repair or replacement of



the front clip. We discovered a few mechanical issues exceeding our capabilities, so we had DMS replace front control arm bushings, replace the parking brake shoes and cable, repair the nonfunctional speedometer drive, and do a four-wheel alignment. J3 and I have since installed a new fuel line and fuel filter using braided stainless steel hose with anodized AN fittings and an Edelbrock filter kit. That really sharpened the under-the-hood appearance and safety compared to the rubber hose, worm gear clamps, and plastic



filter case that came with the car. We've also replaced the battery, installed a battery cut-off switch, installed braided steel flex hoses on the front brakes and flushed the fluid, and successfully obtained a state inspection.

Next up is to replace the rear flex hoses and flush that system, then a coolant flush and replacement of radiator hoses and thermostat. There are enough other less critical projects (various gaskets, vacuum headlight issues, body

panel alignments, maybe headers someday, etc.) to keep us busy for the rest of J3's high school career. Oh, and the paint. The existing paint is truly basket-case condition, so we'll need a nice, driver-quality paint job, probably sooner rather than later (recommendations for a painter are welcomed).

Occasionally, this has become a three-generation project as my son has pitched in when he could take a break from work (he's especially helpful in breaking loose stubborn bolts). Turns out, the rubber bumper C3s are his favorite old Vettes. Through September, the three of us together have invested over 100 man-hours in safety, reliability, and appearance improvements and have had a grand time doing it. Anyone who has worked on these cars knows how frustrating they can sometimes be, so the "mission accomplished" moments are highly satisfying, as are the neighborhood cruises at the end of a successful workday. That old 350 still pulls plenty strong and sounds great.

The immediately apparent objectives of this project are to return a survivor car to prideworthy condition and give our budding engineer some hands-on wrenching experience in the process. We're also gaining a stick-shift trainer and old-school track toy as a bonus. However, the real payoff is that I am getting to spend one-on-one time with my grandson, teaching him a few things I learned in the school of busted knuckles and imparting a little wisdom and philosophy of life along the way. We are enjoying an experience neither of us will soon forget.

LSCC held it's October business meeting at Hula Hut in Little Elm. It was a good turn out of approximately 80 members on on a beautiful Fall day to drive a Corvette. Gary Thomas brought his brand new 2020 C8 Coupe in Zeus Bronze to show. Bill and Dianne Preston were selling 2021 Patriot Paws 13-Month Calendars which are available on the Patriot Paws website. Hope to see everyone in November at Old Texas Brewery Co. in Burleson, and show those new C8's!
